3. MARINE FACILITIES

3.1 CALM MARINE FACILITIES

CALM is progressively establishing interpretative displays, signs and trails in marine parks and nature reserves. They are designed to enrich visitor enjoyment, experience and safety in the marine environment.

A marine visitor centre is established at Milyering (Cape Range National Park, Exmouth) and at Penguin Island. These can be used as a focus for educational activities relating to marine and coastal environments.

The offshore reefs and lagoons of Ningaloo and Marmion Marine Park offer great potential for educational programs. Dive trails are being established with the assistance of community groups. Boyinaboat Reef Trail, offshore from Hillarys Boat Harbour, is the first underwater nature trail in WA.
