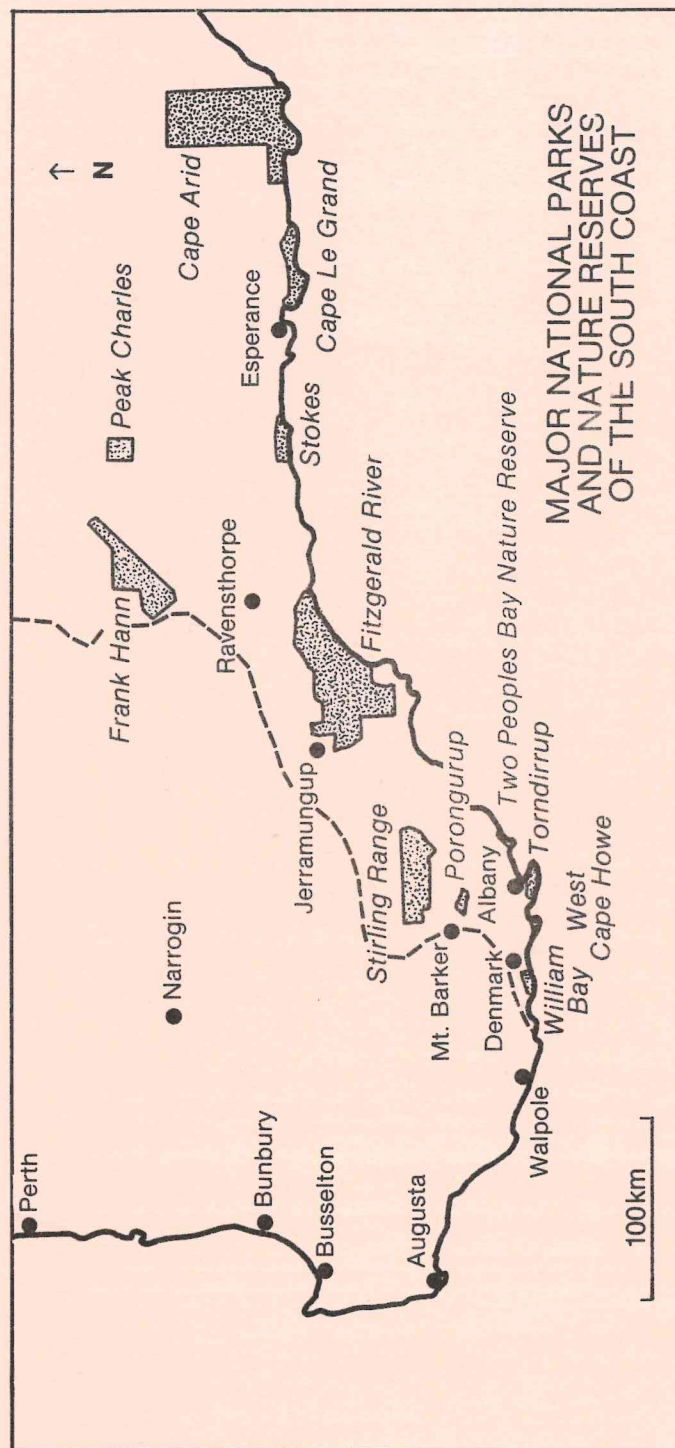

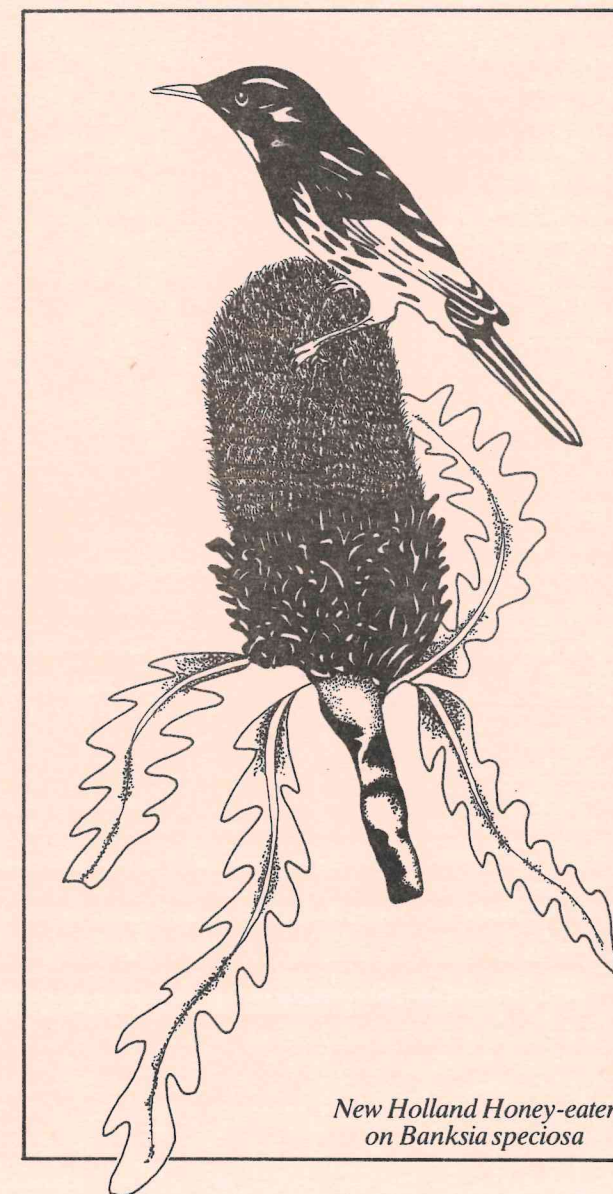

THE SOUTH COAST REGION



CONSERVATION...

In Western Australia many natural areas are looked after by the Department of Conservation and Land Management (CALM). NATIONAL PARKS are areas for nature conservation, landscape preservation and recreation.

NATURE RESERVES are primarily for nature conservation.

STATE FORESTS are mainly for timber production, but also include areas for water catchments, nature conservation and recreation.

TIMBER RESERVES

are to protect particular species of trees or to provide timber for farms.

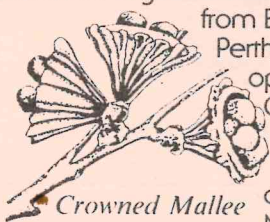
MARINE PARKS AND RESERVES are to protect marine areas for conservation and recreation.

The Department also manages the conservation of flora and fauna throughout the State.

... AND LAND MANAGEMENT

During your visit to these areas you are likely to meet national park rangers, nature reserve officers, wildlife officers, and forest officers, all of whom represent the Department. They are supported by staff in 11 regional offices, and 17 district offices

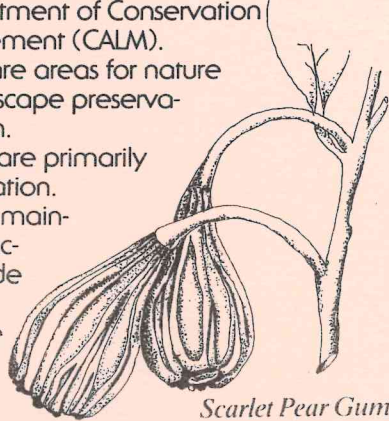
from Esperance to Kununurra. In Perth the Department has an operational headquarters in Como, which provides the regions with support and services, and a policy directorate based at Nedlands.

THE SOUTH COAST REGION

The Department has a South Coast Region, with headquarters in Albany, and a district office in Esperance. This region contains 12 major national parks and over 150 nature reserves: about 15 per cent by area of the reserves in the State. Forestry activities in the region focus on maintaining experimental tree gardens (arboreta) and giving advice on trees to plant on farms.

THE LANDSCAPE

Scenery in the region ranges from the flat and featureless southern Nullarbor, to salmon gum woodlands near Norseman, the Esperance sandplains, low mallee woodlands of the Fitzgerald district, and isolated peaks and mountain ranges which culminate in the magnificent Stirling Range near Albany.

Eastern outliers of the giant karri forests of south-west W.A. appear in the Porongurup National Park. On the coast long curving beaches give way to limestone cliffs, granite headlands, and mobile sand dune systems. The flora and fauna of the region are among the most varied in the State, and often species that appear locally are found nowhere else in the world. Amongst these, many have been gazetted as rare or endangered.

THE NATIONAL PARKS

Visitors are welcome in all national parks, and where possible the Department has provided facilities such as camping areas, bush toilets, fireplaces, picnic areas, marked nature trails and bushwalks, and information shelters. The ranger's office is always signposted for enquiries.

Major national parks in the region are: Cape Arid, Stirling Range, and Fitzgerald River. The Fitzgerald River National Park is classed as an International Biosphere Reserve, which means that the Park is recognized world-wide as one of Australia's most significant areas for flora and fauna.

THE RESERVES

Major nature reserves are Nuytsland Nature Reserve which runs along the Great Australian Bight and southern Nullarbor, the Dundas Nature Reserve near Norseman, and Two Peoples Bay Nature Reserve near Albany, home of the noisy scrub bird. The main

timber reserve is a short distance out of Esperance and contains Helms Arboretum: a tree garden established in 1973 to find which tree species grow best in the harsh environment near Esperance.

DIEBACK

A plant disease known as dieback is widely distributed throughout south-west W.A. This disease kills many species of native plants and is spread rapidly through infected soil on the tyres and underbodies of vehicles. For this reason it is essential that visitors keep their vehicles on well-formed, well-drained roads and obey 'road closed' signs in national parks and other reserves.
