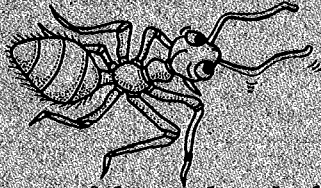

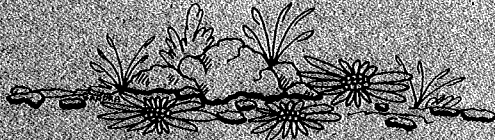

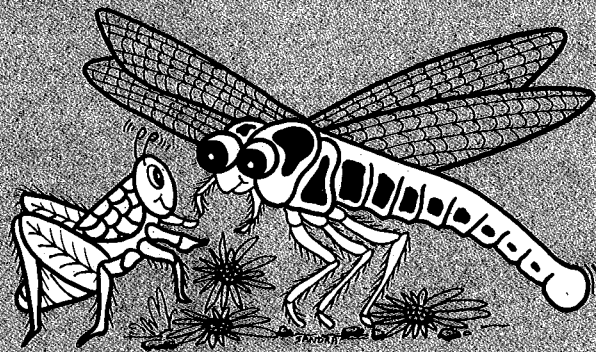

Discovering The Hills Forest is an exciting, new action-packed environmental education program designed and co-ordinated by the Department of Conservation and Land Management (CALM) and sponsored by ICI Australia.

About CALM...

The Department of Conservation and Land Management (CALM) has the task of conserving Western Australia's unique natural heritage for present and future generations.

On behalf of the people of Western Australia, CALM manages a significant portion of the state, including our national parks, State forests, nature reserves, marine parks and timber reserves. It is a large task, and one that requires the awareness, understanding and involvement of the wider community.

In the Perth area, CALM has developed a program called *Perth Outdoors*, designed to help people get outdoors to enjoy and learn more about the natural environment.

Discovering The Hills Forest: A Complete Program of Learning...

Developed and tested in early 1992, *Discovering The Hills Forest* is a local program, written by local educators for local students.

The program explores an ecosystem: the jarrah forest. It develops the concept of how people interact with other parts of this system. Students examine how land use and resource use is linked to their own lifestyle. They then translate this knowledge into action by developing new habits that make wiser use of resources.

What's involved?

A great day out...

Teachers... it's your turn first! Get out into the forest to learn about the complete program. CALM's half day inservice course gives you a program overview, provides you with teaching materials and gives you a taste of the activities the students will tackle during the excursion.

Back to the classroom...

Take this information back to the classroom, and prepare for the excursion with some pre-visit activities.

To the field...

Your one-day field trip into the jarrah forest at Mundaring involves two active sessions in which students learn

about the forest, its plants, animals and landscapes. They also learn how people interact with the forest.

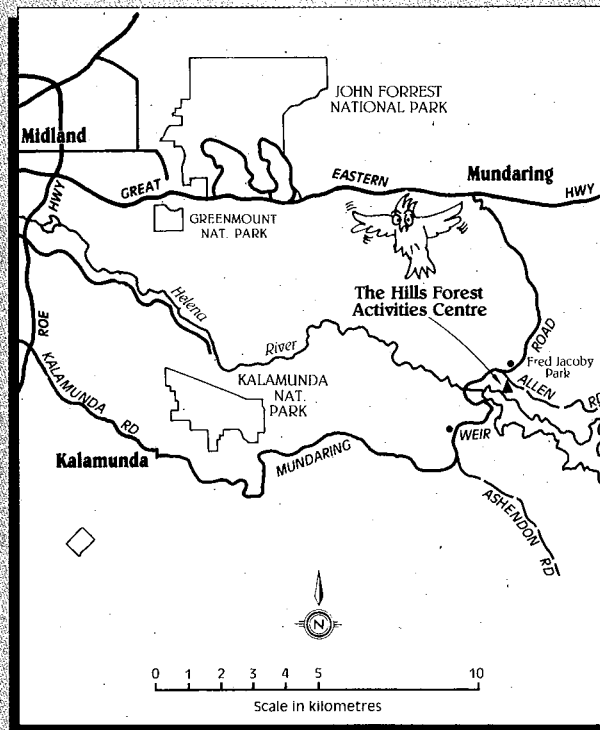
and into their lives...

Classroom activities follow up the concepts introduced in the field. Students can then examine their use of one forest resource intensely and take action towards lessening their impact.
