If you haven't visited Yanchep National Park lately you may notice some improvements.

Since 1905 the park has been an important recreation area for many Western Australians. Visitors enjoy the tranquillity and beauty of the park's setting on the Swan Coastal Plain, the unique flora and fauna, and its historical and natural features.

As custodian of the park, the Department of Conservation and Land Management is determined continue to provide those facilities and recreational opportunities for which Yanchep National Park is famous. while further enhancing the park's role as a major tourist destination in Western Australia.

Visitors are encouraged to take park in activities such as bush walking, photography and bird-watching, and to discover many of the park's unique features.

Visitors enjoy the tranquillity and beauty of the park.

Recreation facilities such as the picnic areas and gardens are being upgraded plans for an adventure playground and small backpack camping area will be developed.

Renovations and refitting of Ness House Visitor Centre is underway as well as repairs and restoration of Yanchep Inn.

Relax, Encounter, Explore & Discover

Relax in a peaceful setting on the shores of Loch McNess. Free picnic and BBQ facilities are provided throughout the park. Hire a row boat and enjoy the tranquillity of Loch Mc-Ness or jump on the MV Kiwanis for a launch ride around the lake.

Encounter some of Australia's unique wildlife with kangaroos roaming freely, friendly waterbirds and colourful bush birds willing to share your lunch or visit the koala compound to see Australia's most popular marsu-

Explore and Discover all of the features of Yanchep National Park - Wetlands, Woodlands, Heritage and Caves.

Along the walk trails at Yanchep there are many interesting ways to spend an hour or two. Explore the wetlands, walk inside a collapsed cave or spend the whole day on the Ghost House Trail.

Yanchep is steeped in history, throughout the recreation area are heritage buildings built in the 1930's. One of these, Gloucester Lodge, is now a museum documenting the history of the local area.

Join one of the daily guided tours of Crystal Cave or if your looking for some adventure check to see when our Adventure Caving or Yonderup Cave activities are scheduled.
