

The Department of Conservation and Land Management (CALM) is responsible for the management of WA's national parks, conservation parks, regional parks, marine parks, State forests and timber reserves, nature reserves and marine nature reserves. CALM is also responsible for conserving native plants and animals throughout the State and managing their sustainable use.

Aboriginal heritage is an important value in the areas managed by CALM. For this reason, Aboriginal people participate with CALM in the planning for land, marine and wildlife management programs. Aboriginal employment programs seek projects and funds for Aboriginal participation in site developments in areas managed by CALM.

## Experiencing Aboriginal heritage and culture

CALM's Aboriginal Tourism, Education and Training Unit provides opportunities for people to experience Aboriginal heritage, with Aboriginal people, in the natural environment.

The unit comprises mainly Aboriginal staff who operate on the principle that caring for Aboriginal heritage is best communicated by Aboriginal people with the support of the local Aboriginal community.

We develop cultural learning experiences for all people. The focus is on interactive activities in the bush, from an Aboriginal perspective. These programs provide employment opportunities for Aboriginal people.
