# Ordering Trees

## Conditions of Sale

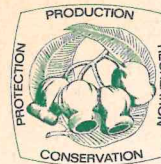
1. The distribution season commences 1st May and closes on 31st August.
2. Plants are sold on the understanding that they are not to be offered for resale.
3. No trees will be despatched to applicants within the city or suburban areas or to any destination outside Western Australia.
4. Orders for the supply of more than 10 trees will be forwarded to nominated sidings by road or rail transport *without* an additional charge for freight. Orders for less than 10 trees must be picked up at the nursery.
5. Trees are despatched from the nursery well packed, in good order and condition. Thereafter they travel at the consignee's risk and the Forests Department will not accept any further responsibility.
6. Prices listed are those currently ruling for the season closing 31st August 1972; thereafter prices are subject to annual review.
7. When firm orders to the value of \$40 or more are placed with the Nursery not later than 15th September in the year prior to that in which delivery is required, a discount of  $7\frac{1}{2}\%$  on the list price ruling at the 31st August 1972 will be allowed. The order must be accompanied by a remittance for the correct amount.

Advance orders for open rooted pine must be placed with the Nursery 12 months prior to the season of planting. Orders in excess of 2,000 trees will not be accepted except under special arrangements negotiated with the Forests Department.
8. Orders for less than five trees will be charged at the single tree rate. Orders for five or more trees will be charged at the five tree rate.
9. When it is not possible to supply the trees ordered, substitute trees will be supplied, up to a value of \$2, unless specific instructions to the contrary are given at the time the order is placed.

A cash refund will be made when the difference between the value of the trees supplied and the amount paid exceeds \$2.
10. The Nursery reserves the right to supply a lesser number of trees than were ordered when the accompanying remittance is insufficient to cover the full value of the order.
11. A remittance made payable to the Forests Department must accompany each order for trees. Postage stamps will not be accepted.

## Advice to Clients

1. Please study conditions of sale.
2. When ordering it is advisable to indicate a second choice. Failing instructions to the contrary, suitable trees of other species or varieties may be substituted when the trees ordered are out of stock. When stocks of any species are limited, orders placed in advance or early in the season are more likely to be filled to the satisfaction of the client.
3. To avoid disappointment, clients requiring large numbers of trees are requested to place orders well in advance so as to enable adequate stocks to be produced (see conditions of sale No. 7 for discount offered on advance orders).
4. Local authorities and other public bodies are requested to confine their orders for trees for Arbor Day to the number actually required for planting on that day, and to list separately for supply at some other time trees for their ordinary requirements.
5. Clients are requested to use the order form supplied with the price list when such is available.
