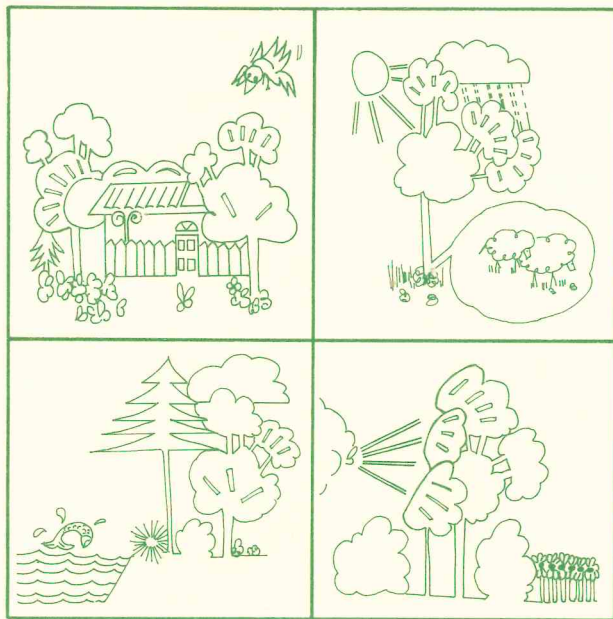

Conditions of Sale

1. The distribution season commences 1st May and closes on 31st August.
2. Orders received prior to commencement of season will be despatched during May unless a despatch date is nominated.
3. Orders received during nursery season will be despatched within 14 days of receipt of order.
4. Plants are sold on the understanding that they are not to be offered for resale.
5. No trees will be despatched to applicants within the city or suburban areas or to any destination outside Western Australia.
6. Orders for the supply of 10 or more trees will be forwarded to nominated sidings by road or rail transport *without* an additional charge for freight. Orders for less than 10 trees will not be accepted.
7. Trees are despatched from the nursery well packed, in good order and condition. Thereafter they travel at the consignee's risk and the Forests Department will not accept any further responsibility.
8. Substitutes will be made for trees not available at time of despatch unless the order is clearly marked otherwise.
9. The Nursery reserves the right to supply a lesser number of trees than were ordered when the accompanying remittance is insufficient to cover the full value of the order.
10. A remittance made payable to the Forests Department must accompany each order for trees. Postage stamps will not be accepted.

Advice to Clients

1. Clients requiring large numbers of trees are requested to place orders by 31st July of the previous year so as to enable adequate stocks to be produced.
2. Clients are requested to use the order form supplied with the price list when such is available.

Potted Stock

These are young trees raised in individual containers; usually 10 cm depth plastic pots.

Price including rail freight—

90 cents per tree.

Advanced stock

Some species available. Please apply to nurseries for current list. This stock must be collected at the nursery, or railed at customer's expense. Price on application.

Tray stock

Seedlings raised in plastic trays (approx. 25 seedlings per tray).

Price \$10.00 per tray.

Please note that although all species are available as seedling stock in individual containers, only certain species, as indicated on the order form by an asterick (*), are also available in trays.

Pines (in bundles)

Pinus radiata and Pinus pinaster only.

Bundles of 100: \$6.00 per 100.

Bundles of 1000: \$40.00 per 1000.

Pine seedlings are not available for sale after 31st July each year.
