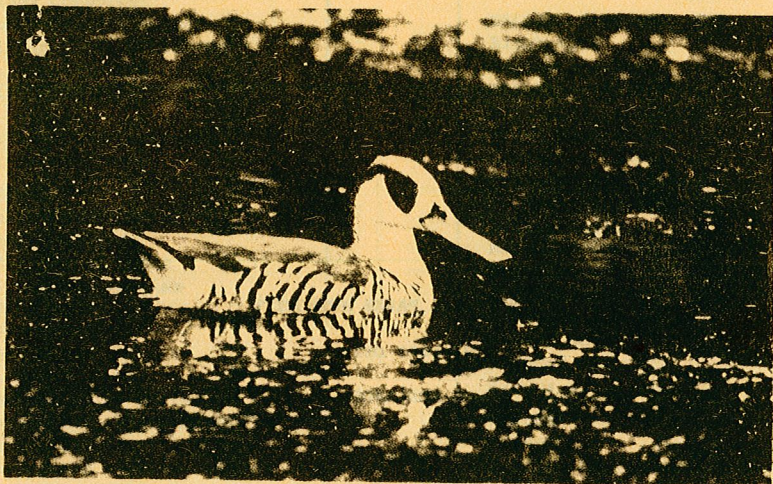

A CHECKLIST OF THE BIRDS OF KALBARRI NATIONAL PARK

This list contains the names of all birds recorded in recent years from Kalbarri National Park. It also includes birds seen on the shore around Kalbarri townsite but does not include truly marine birds such as the Petrels. The names and sequence follow "A Fieldguide to Australian Birds" by Peter Slater. The list is probably not complete. Any species you observe that are not on this list would be valuable records.
