

The Department of Conservation and Land Management (CALM) has been planting bluegums with private landowners in the south-west since 1988. These early trials led to today's multi-million dollar tree crops, helping to diversify farm incomes, boost local employment and offer significant landcare benefits.

Sharefarming with CALM means pooling resources to grow bluegum crops on your property for two rotations. Each rotation will average ten years, depending on site productivity.

The land remains yours, the trees are planted and managed by CALM and the project is financed by investors who take delivery of the crop at harvest.
