Back from the brink.

The woylie has rebounded from the brink of extinction to become one of Dryandra's most common residents.

The woylie (*Bettongia penicillata*) is one of Dryandra's best known inhabitants, and is frequently seen around the Dryandra Village. Until the mid 1990s it was considered to be endangered right across Australia.

Thanks to CALM's Western Shield fox baiting program, the future of this little animal is secure, and woylies from Dryandra are now translocated to other suitable fox-free sites in Western Australia and interstate.
