unique tingle forest

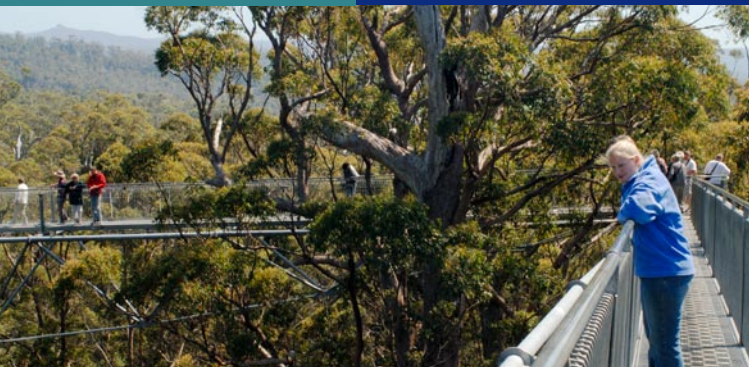


A giant of an

Western Australia's world-famous tingle trees are some of the most enormous trees in the world and can only be seen in the Walpole Wilderness in WA's Southern Forests Region.

The Tree Top Walk — one of three sites in the Wilderness Discovery Centre — soars 40 metres into the tingle canopy and opens up a world that most people never see.

The Ancient Empire Walk meanders through a grove of veteran trees at ground level and gives visitors another perspective of these magnificent giants.

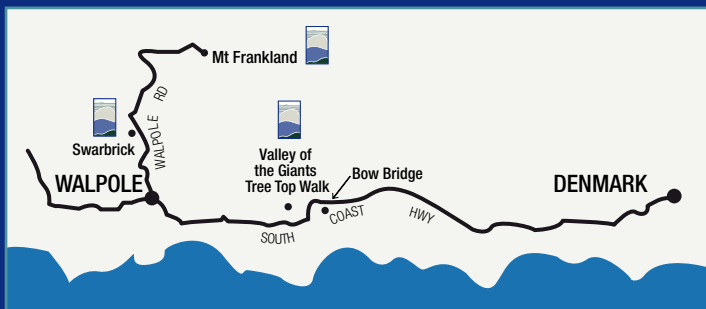
