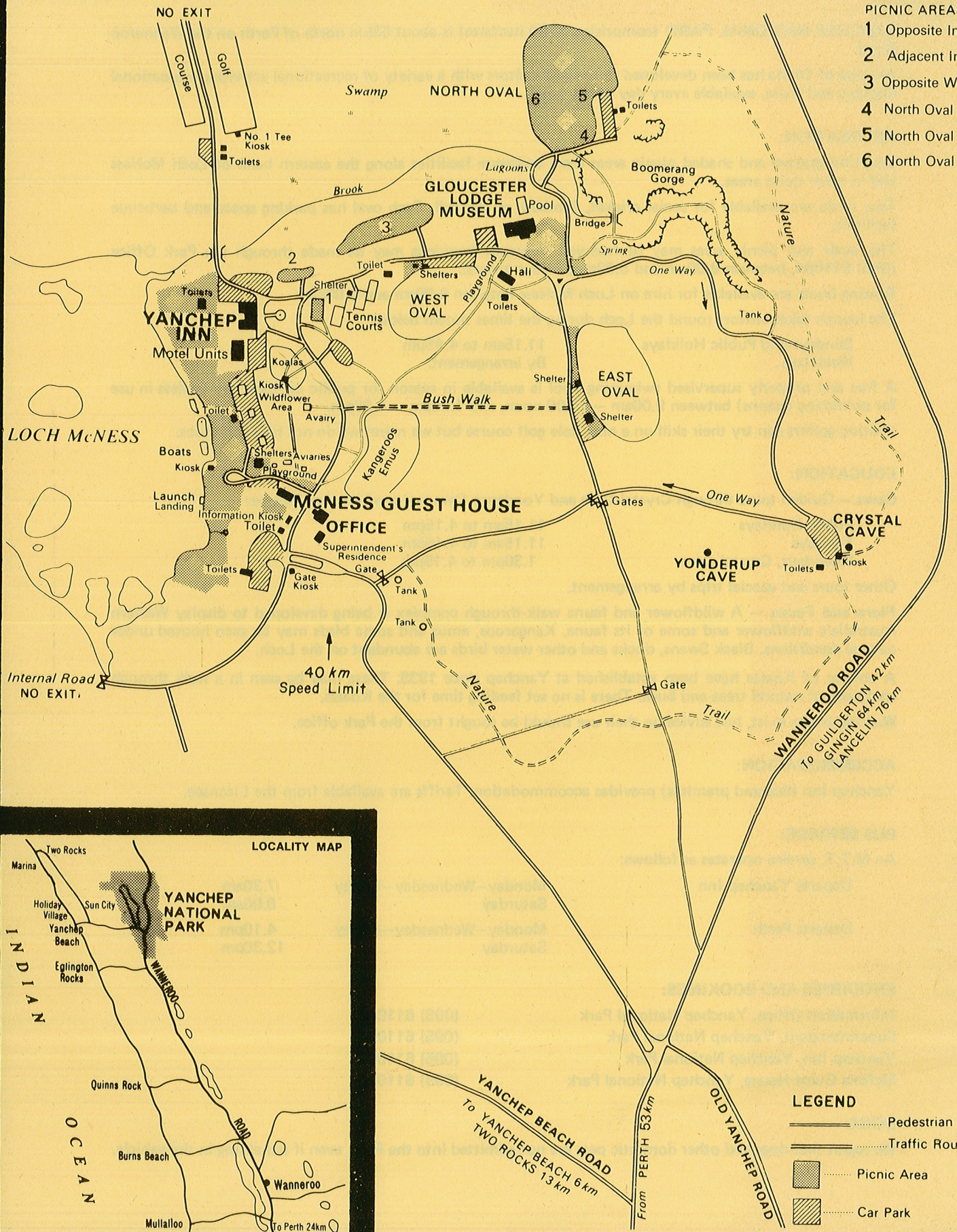

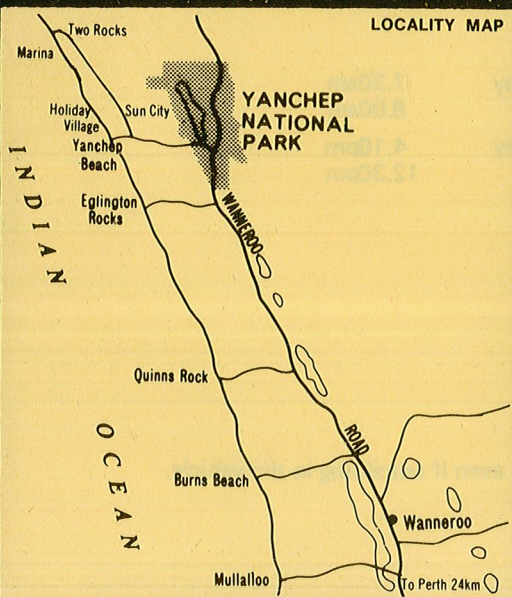

YANCHEP NATIONAL PARK (comprising 2790 hectares) is about 53km north of Perth on the Wanneroo Road.

An area of 141ha has been developed to provide visitors with a variety of recreational activities, educational displays and tours, available every day of the year.

RECREATION:

Beautiful grassed and shaded picnic areas have barbeque facilities along the eastern bank of Loch McNess and in other quiet areas.

Two ovals are available for social cricket, football, or softball. Each oval has parking space and barbeque facilities.

The ovals and picnic areas may be reserved. Advance bookings may be made through the Park Office (095) 611004, between 9.00am and 5.00pm, 7 days a week.

Rowing boats are available for hire on Loch McNess between 9.00am and 4.00pm.

The launch takes visitors round the Loch during the times shown below:

Sundays and Public Holidays	11.15am to 4.45pm
Weekdays	By arrangement.

A free and properly supervised swimming pool is available in season for public use each day (unless in use for swimming lessons) between 9.00am – 12.00 noon, and 1.00pm – 4.30pm.

Visiting golfers can try their skill on a nine hole golf course but we regret we do not hire golf clubs.

EDUCATION:

Caves – Guided tours through Crystal Cave and Yonderup Cave are conducted as follows:

Public Holidays	11.15am to 4.15pm
Sundays	11.15am to 4.45pm
Weekdays, Crystal Cave	1.30pm to 4.15pm

Other tours and special trips by arrangement.

Flora and Fauna – A wildflower and fauna walk-through complex is being developed to display Western Australia's wildflower and some of its fauna. Kangaroos, emus and some birds may be seen housed under natural conditions. Black Swans, ducks and other water birds are abundant on the Loch.

A colony of Koalas have been established at Yanchep since 1938. These may be seen in a walk through enclosure of natural trees and bush. There is no set feeding time for the Koalas.

Walking tracks exist, but advice on their use should be sought from the Park office.

ACCOMMODATION:

Yanchep Inn (licensed premises) provides accommodation. Tariffs are available from the Licensee.
