This scenic drive passes through some of the finest wheatlands in the District. In earlier times this same area saw some of the State's very early conflicts between Aborigines and European settlers, resulting in the spearing of a shepherd and the hanging of those responsible. The site of this hanging is on Butterabby Road, and a full account of the events leading up to it has been documented and is available at the Shire Office. The drive continues to the picturesque Coalseam National Park and we suggest you try the "Scenic Drive". You will be treated to some magnificent landscape views of the Irwin River and beyond from the top of the cliff face - A must for artists and photographers! This route is made possible by the generosity of the landowner, and you are requested to keep your vehicle strictly to the track. Entry to the property is at your own risk and no responsibility for personal injury or property damage will be taken by the Shire or property owner. Please leave gates as you find them ... open or closed!

The recommended time for this trip and return is one full day from MULLEWA. The total mileage for the round trip is 122.2 kilometres.
