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





Purnululu National Park

North West

Purnululu National Park protects one of the world's most unforgettable natural wonders, the Bungle Bungle Range, deep in the rugged east Kimberley. The remarkable tiger-striped, beehive-shaped rock domes have become one of the iconic images of the Australian outback and are appreciated worldwide for their exceptional natural beauty. Exploration through Purnululu National Park reveals a hidden world of gorges and pools. Take an easy 2km walk into Echidna Chasm to look up the sheer rock walls rising 100m above you, or if you are well prepared, try the scenic bushwalk along Piccaninny Creek and camp overnight. Other walks include Mini Palms Walk, Catherdral Gorge which is known for its incredible natural acoustics, the Domes Walk, Homestead Gorge, Piccaninny Creek Lookout, Whip Snake Gorge and the Northern Escarpment walk.

Purnululu National Park is only open during the dry season – usually April to November, weather permitting.

Cape Range National Park

North West

Cape Range National Park, on the western side of the North West Cape, is a rugged landscape of rocky gorges edged by the stunning coastal environment of Ningaloo Marine Park. Ningaloo, the longest fringing coral reef in Australia, is a mecca for scuba divers, snorkelers and whale-watchers. Boating, fishing and surfing are enjoyed near the many campgrounds within the park and as a special highlight; a trip to Yardie Creek is a must. Take a guided boat tour down the creek that flows between sheer cliffs and enjoy spotting wildlife in this tranquil gorge setting. Cape Range National Park also offers walk trails, scenic lookouts and a bird hide. Milyering Visitor Centre to the north of the park is a wonderful place to stop and find out more about Cape Range National Park and its attractions.

Highlights:

Highlights in the area include the appearance of the world's largest fish, the whale shark; nesting three of the world's seven species of marine turtle; and the humpback whale migration.



Karijini National Park

North West

Set in the Hamersley Range in the heart of the Pilbara, the vast Karijini National Park is an ancient landscape of massive mountains and steep escarpments cut by spectacular gorges more than 100m deep. Within these sheer-sided chasms hide crystal-clear rock pools, cascading waterfalls and lush vegetation. A trip to Karijini National Park is not complete without a visit to the breathtaking Dales Gorge, Fortescue Falls, Weano Gorge and Oxers Lookout.

Best time of year to visit is from May to October. The winter days are warm and clear, but the nights can be very cold.

Walpole-Nornalup National Park South West

Walpole-Nornalup National Park is 430km south of Perth, surrounding the town of Walpole on the State's south coast. It is renowned for its forest of rare red tingle trees, known as the Valley of the Giants. These 'giants', the most massive of all eucalypts and unique to the Walpole area, can be seen from the breathtaking heights of the Tree Top Walk.



Warren National Park South West

Warren National Park is home to some of the State's most majestic karri trees. The 3,131-hectare park is regarded as a prime example of virgin karri forest. Karri grows up to 90m high, making it the tallest tree in Western Australia and one of the tallest in the world. Some of these forest giants in Warren National Park are more than 200 years old. River banksias, peppermints and Warren River cedar line the riverbanks while the pretty red coral vine and white clematis climb over tree trunks and fallen logs. The Warren River is plentiful in marron and trout and is a joy to meander down in a canoe.

Bramley National Park South West

Bramley National Park is located just 400m from Margaret River township and is a gateway to breathtaking forest experiences and world class mountain bike trails. This beautiful park is home to a diverse range of plants and animals and has multiple waterways to fish or launch your canoe in.



Wellington National Park South West

Whether you enjoy spending your summer days lazing by a gently flowing river or tranquil lake, or prefer the more athletic pursuits of cycling and bushwalking, Wellington National Park is for you. To the west of Collie, the national park also offers fishing and canoeing, and in spring visitors can enjoy a wonderful wildflower display. The park's central feature is the beautiful Collie River valley, with its ancient gorge behind Wellington Dam.
