

Birds of Karijini





Most of the species recorded in this birdlist were observed and recorded by Ian Soloman (Ranger- in -Charge 1977-1984) and his wife Eve.

Although the comments on abundance and habitat reflect observations in the Park, they frequently (but not always) mirror what can be seen elsewhere in the Pilbara. The nomenclature and sequence follows Grahan Pizzey's "A Field Guide to Birds of Australia".

We still have a great deal to learn about birds in Karijini National Park. If you see a bird in the Park which is not on the list, or if you make an interesting or unusual observation, we would like to hear from you.

NAME	COMMENTS
Emu Dromaius novaehollandiae	Uncommon. Usually in pairs on spinifex - eucalypt areas.
Hoary-headed Grebe Podiceps poliocephalus	Uncommon. Has been seen in Joffre Gorge and on a pond near Marandoo.
Little Grebe	Uncommon. In gorges and on pools in the southern section of the park.
	Rare; Has been seen near Marandoo and once in Joffre Gorge.
Anhinga melanogaster	. Rare. Has been seen on Crossing and Coppin Pools.
Pied Cormorant Phalacrocorax varius	. Rare. Has been seen in Dales Gorge and on Crossing Pool.
Little Pied Cormorant	. Rare. Recorded in Dales Gorge.
Little Black Cormorant	. Uncommon. On pools throughout the park.
White-necked Heron	. Common. In Gorges and on pools thoughout the park.
White-faced Heron	. Uncommon. In gorges and on pools throughout the park.
Large Egret Egretta alba	. Rare. Has been seen on a pond at Marandoo.
Nankeen Night Heron Nycticorax caledonicus	. Rare. Two known colonies in gorges.
Straw-necked lbis	. Uncommon. In groups of up to 50 during the wet season.
Black Duck	. Uncommon. On pools during the wet season.
Grey Teal	. Uncommon. On pools throughout the park.
Pink-eared Duck	Rare. Recorded on a pond near Marandoo.
White-eyed Duck	Rare. Has been seen on Coppin Pool.
Wood DuckChenonetta jubata	Rare. One pair seen in January 1981 and one bird in December 1982 at the Ranger's house.

Black-shouldered Kite	Uncommon. Has been seen in Marandoo, Coppin Pool and Dales Gorge areas.
Fork-tailed Kite Milvus migrans	Rare. Seen at Marandoo and at the Ranger's house during 1980.
Black-breasted Kite Hamirostra melanosternon	Rare. Has been seen near Marandoo an Mt Bruce.
Whistling Kite Haliastur sphenurus	Uncommon. Ocasionally seen along watercourses.
Australian Goshawk Accipiter fasciatus	Uncommon. Single birds and pairs have been seen along watercourses.
Collared Sparrowhawk	Common. Along creeks and more densely vegetated gullies.
Wedge-tailed Eagle Aquila audax	Uncommon. Single birds have been seen near Yampire and Hamersley Gorges.
Little Eagle Hieraaetus morphnoides	Rare. Recorded near Dales Gorge in 1979 and 1980.
Spotted Harrier	Common. In open spinifex - eucalypt areas.
Peregrine Falcon Falco peregrinus	Uncommon. Has been seen near Dales Gorge and Marandoo,
Little Falcon Falco longipennis	Uncommon. Has been seen along tree-lined watercourses.
Grey Falcon	Rare. Has been seen near the Ranger's house.
Brown Falcon	Common. In a wide variety of habitats.
Nankeen Kestrel	Common. Throughout the park.
Little Button-quail Turnix velox	Common. On spinifex and soft grass flats.
Black-tailed Native-hen Gallinula ventralis	Rare. Seen 3km north of Ranger's house in January 1981.
Coot Fulica atra	Rare. One in Kalamina Gorge September 1981 and one on Milli-Milli Spring November 1981.
Australian Bustard	Common. Single birds and pairs on spinifes and soft grass flats.

Bush Stone-curlew	Uncommon. Has been heard in Joffre Creek area and near the Ranger's house.
Australian Dotterel Peltohyas australis	Very uncommon. Stony hillsides.
Red-capped Dotterel	Rare. Seen once after a cyclone near the Ranger's house, January 1980.
Black-fronted Dotterel	Common. Most pools with muddy banks in the park.
Pied Stilt Himantopus himantopus	Joffre Creek and the Ranger's house.
Peaceful Dove	Uncommon. Has been seen near Coppin Pool and the Ranger's house.
Diamond Dove	Common. Throughout the park.
Common Bronzewing Phaps chalcoptera	Common. Throughout the park. It can be seen coming to water at dusk
Crested Pigeon	Common. Throughout the park in open country and along watercourses.
Spinifex Pigeon Petrophassa plumifera	Common. Around most of the gorges and along creeks.
Red-tailed Black Cockatoo	Rare. Recorded by Harry Bulter at Dale's Gorge.
Galah Cacatua roseicapilla	Common. Along watercourses, nesting in Eucalyptus sp.
Little Corella	Common. Along creeks and gorges, nesting in <u>Eucalyptus</u> sp.
Cockatiel	Uncommon. In small flocks along watercourses.
Budgerigar Melopsittacus undulatus	Common. Flock throughout the park, congregating near water.
Port Lincoln Parrot	Common. Along creeks and gorges with river gums.
Mulga Parrot Psepnotus varius	Rare. One recorded by Harry Bulter near Marandoo in 1978.
Bourke's Parrot Neophema bourkii	Rare. Has been seen in grassy mulga country towards Mt Bruce.

NAME	COMMENTS
Pallid Cuckoo	Common. Throughout the park. Hooded Robins seen feeding young in October 1978.
Black-eared Cuckoo	Rare. Collected by Bulter in 1976 and one sighted 4km west of Mt Bruce.
Horsfield's Bronze-cuckoo	Common. In <u>Acacia</u> spp. On rocky hills and in Mulga.
Boobook Owl	Common. Throughout the park. Frequently seen on roads at night.
Barking Owl Ninox connivens	Uncommon. A pair lives near the spring in Yampire Gorge.
Barn Owl	Rare. Two birds seen by Butler in 1976 and pellets found west of Mt Bruce 1982.
Tawny Frogmouth	Common. Throughout the park. Often seen on roads at night.
	Uncommon. Throught the park. Sometimes seen on roads at night
	Common. Throughout the park. Often seen on roads at night.
Fork-tailed Swift	Uncommon. Occasionally seen during the wet season.
Blue-winged Kookaburra Dacelo leachii	Common. In river gums along the creeks and gorges.
Red-backed Kingfisher Halcyon pyrrhopyaia	Common. Wide variety of habitats.
Sacred Kingfisher	Uncommon. Along gorge and watercourses.
Rainbow Bee-eater	Uncommon. May be seen hawking over pools in gorges.
Singing Bushlark	Rare. Only two sightings; near Mt Bruce and near Dales Gorge.
Tree Martin	Common. Colonies in Yampire Gorge and near Coppin Pool. Associated with big trees.
Fairy Martin	. Uncommon. Nests have been found in the Mt Bruce area.
Richard's Pipit	. Uncommon. Most often seen on stony spinifex country.

Black-faced Cuckoo-shirke	Common. Troughout park.
White-winged Triller	Common. Mulga and eucalypt woodlands.
Red-capped Robin Petroica goodenovii	Uncommon. Dense Mulga.
Hooded Robin	Common. Mainly Mulga woodlands.
Rufous Whistler	Common. Throughout the park especially in Mulga.
Grey Strike-thrush Colluricincla harmonica	Common. Along watercourses and gorges.
Crested Bellbird	- Uncommon. Open woodlands and creek sides. More often heard than seen.
Grey Fantail	Rare. In dense Mulga thickets.
Willie Wagtail Rhipidura leucophrys	Common. Troughout the park.
Wedgebill	Uncommon. In <u>Acacia</u> thickets along gullies. More often heard than seen.
Grey-crowned Babbler Pomastostomus temporalis	Uncommon. In dense Mulga and in Acacia scrub along creeks.
Clamorous Reed Warbler	Rare. Recorded in Dales Gorge.
Spinifexbird Eremiornis carteri	Uncommon. Usually in dense spinifex, also soft grasses along creeks.
Brown Songlark	Uncommon. Open Mulga and grasslands.
Rufous Songlark	Common. Mulga, also eucalypts along watercourses.
Variegated Wren Maurus lamberti	Common. Throughout the park, in Mulga and in <u>Acacia</u> scrub along gullies and gorges.
Blue-and-white Wren Malurus leucopterus	Uncommon. Spinifex and scattered Acacias or flat country.
Rufous-crowned Emu-wren Stipiturus ruficeps	Uncommon. Spinifex on flats and hills.

NAME	COMMENTS
Striated Grass Wren	Uncommon. Spinifex. Has been seen around Weano campsite.
Redthroat Sericornis brunneus	Rare. Recorded in 1980 in open Mulga.
Weebill Smicrornis brevirostris	Common. In snappy gums on ranges and in river gums along creeks.
Whit-tailed Warbler Greygone fusca	Reported by WA Museum staff in 1980.
Broad-tailed Thornbill	Reported by WA Museum staff in 1980.
Chestnut-rumped Thornbill	Common. Open to dense Mulga woodland.
Slate-backed Thornbill	Rare. It has been seen in Mulga near Marandoo.
Yellow-rumped Thornbill Acanthiza chrysorrhoa	Uncommon. Seen in acacias along the creek edges near the Ranger's house 1980 and 1981.
Varied Sittella Daphoenositta chrysoptera	Uncommon. In Mulga - eucalypt woodlands along creeks.
Black-tailed Treecreeper	 Uncommon. Snappy Gums and river gums along creeks.
Spiny-cheeked Honeyeater Acanthagenys rufogularis	Common. All types of woodlands.
White-rumped Miner Manorina flavigula	Common. Along gorges and watercources.
Singing Honeyeater Lichenostomus virescens	Uncommon. Has been seen around Marandoo in woodland with flowering acacias,
Grey-headed Honeyeater Lichenostomus keartlandi	 Common. Throughout the Park particularly in flowering plants.
White-plumed Honeyeater Lichenostomus penicillatus	Common. Along the creeks and in gorges. (wild canary)
Golden-backed Honeyeater Melithreptus laetior	Uncommon. It has been seen above Jofre and Dales Gorges and at Coppin Pool and at the Ranger's house.
Brown HoneyeaterLichmera indistincta	Common. In acacia thickets along creeks and in snappy gum woodland.

NAME	COMMENTS
White-fronted Honeyeater	Uncommon. Reported by Butler in 1976 near Coppin Pool and in the 1980, WA Museum staff.
Grey Honeyeater	Rare. One sighted near Joffre Gorge and one at the Ranger's house.
Black Honeyeater Certhionyx niger	Uncommon. Observed in Mulga with Eromophila frazeri.
Pied Honeyeater Certhionyx variegatus	Rare. Has been seen at Marandoo and at the Ranger's house.
Crimson Chat	Common. (Nomadic). On roads in Mulga, and on open flats.
Orange Chat	Rare. Sighted at the Ranger's house in January 1981.
Mistletoebird	Uncommon. Along major watercourses with eucalypts.
Red-browned Pardalote	Uncommon. In eucalypts along creeks.
Striated Pardalote	Common. In snappy gums on slopes and around gorges.
Painted Firetail Emblema picta	Common. In stony spinifex country e.g. around gorges.
Star Finch Neochmia ruficauda	Uncommon. Has been seen near Coppin Pool and one nested in buffle grass near the Ranger's house.
Zebra Finch <i>Poephila guttata</i>	Common. Throughout the park near water.
Spotted Bowerbird	Common. In gorges, especially around wild figs (<u>Ficus platypoda</u>)
Magpie Lark Grallina cyanoleuca	Common. In families along watercourses.
Masked Woodswallow Artamus personatus	Uncommon. (Nomadic) may be seen in flocks throughout the park.
Black-faced Woodswallow	Common. Mulga - eucalypt woodland and along watercourses.
Little Woodswallow	Common. Frequently near cliffs. Can be seen around most gorges.

NAME	COMMENTS
Grey Butcherbird	Uncommon. Mulga - eucalypt woodland.
Pied Butcherbird	Common. Along gorges and creeks in eucalypts.
Australian Magpie	Uncommon. Along gorges and in open woodlands.
Torresian Crow	Common. Along gorges and watercourses around settlements.
Little Crow	Uncommon. Small flocks reported throughout the park.
