Everyone wants a photo through
Nature's Window in Kalbarri National
Park. It's great to share images of people
sitting in front of the window like this.
What you can't see is fragile rock and
the steep drop on the other side.

Despite the clear safety sign, some visitors still put themselves at risk by climbing on, or into, the window and having photos taken.

There is also the potential for bits of rock to break off and damage the window.

You can help prevent risky behaviour and damage to this popular but fragile attraction.

- Please do not climb on top of, or into, Nature's Window.
- Please do not share or retweet photos of people on top of or climbing into Nature's Window.



Nature's Window is fragile and potentially unstable.

For your safety:

- Do not climb on top of Nature's Window.
- Do not sit directly beneath Nature's Window.
