Pilbara inshore islands nature reserves and proposed additions draft management plan 2020

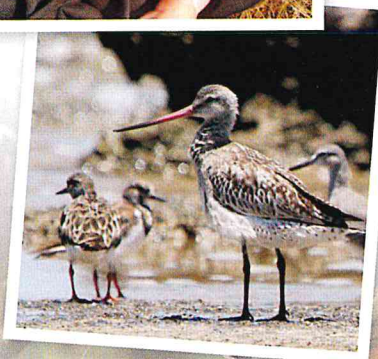
You are invited to review the draft plan and contribute ideas on how the Pilbara inshore island nature reserves and proposed additions will be managed. The draft plan outlines how the natural, cultural and social values of the island reserves will be protected and conserved over the next 10 years and into the future.

The plan covers 174 islands, islets and rocks between Exmouth Gulf and Cape Preston. The islands provide habitat for a variety of threatened species including turtles and birds.

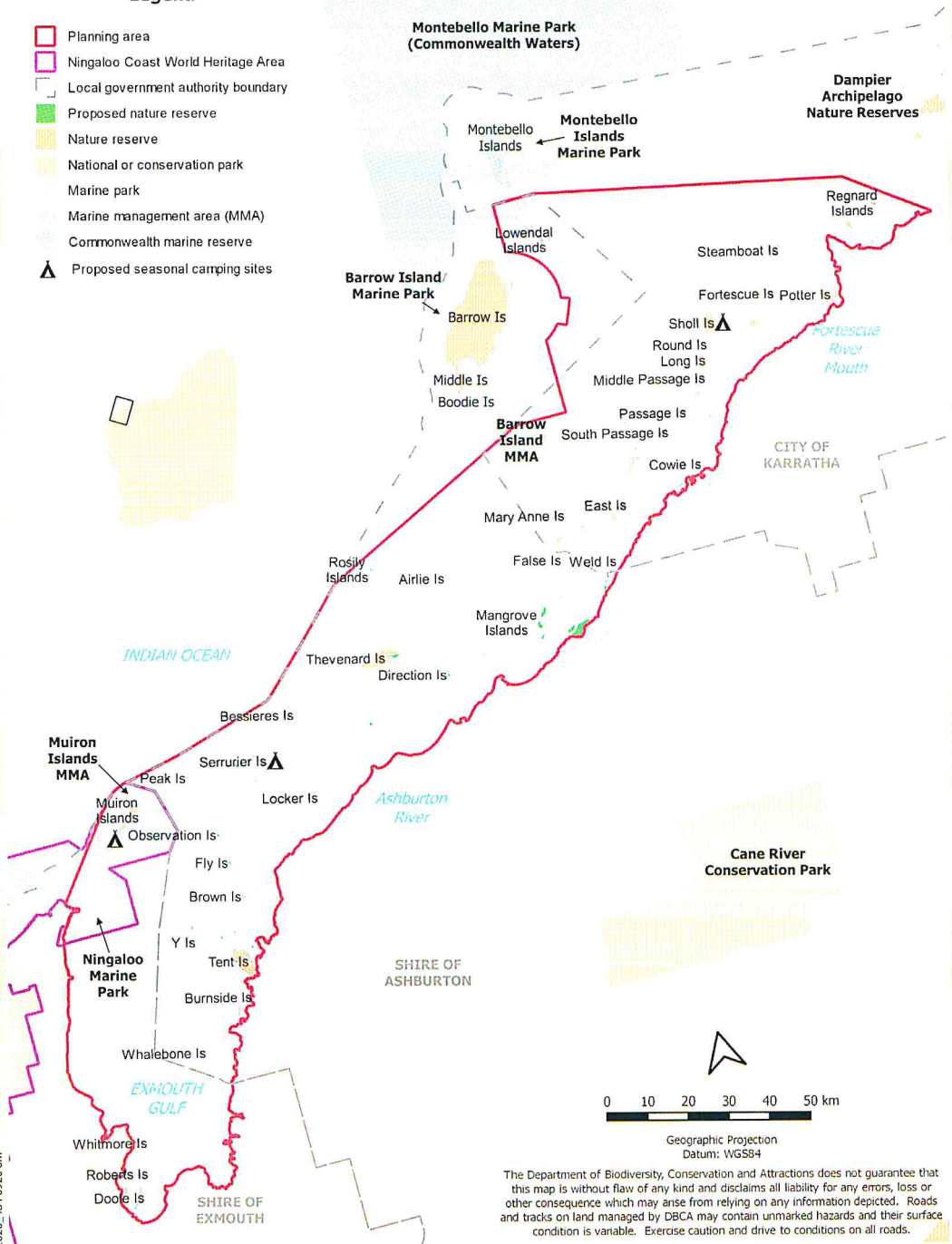
