Rare flora of the Perenjori area

These rare species are found in very small numbers at only a few locations. They are threatened by land clearing, drought, weed invasion and grazing.

Net-veined gyrostemon
(*Gyrostemon reticulatus*)



Habitat Dense shrubland in disturbed areas
Description A shrub to one metre tall
Flowering time August to December

Loveable triggerplant
(*Stylidium amabile*)



Habitat Scrub on lateritic gravel
Description A herb six to 23 centimetres tall
Flowering time September to October

Acacia woodmaniorum



Habitat On banded ironstone and laterite on ranges and disturbed ground
Description A shrub to 2 metres tall
Flowering time July

Silky eremophila
(*Eremophila nivea*)



Habitat Open York Gum woodland and open scrub, usually near the edge of seasonal creeks
Description A shrub one to two metres tall
Flowering time August to October

Beaked eremophila
(*Eremophila rostrata* subsp. *trifida*)



Habitat Open woodland
Description A shrub to three metres tall
Flowering time September to October

Jingymia mallee
(*Eucalyptus synandra*)



Habitat Undulating or flat country with heath and scrub on sand and sandy loam
Description A mallee tree 3.5 to 10 metres tall
Flowering time December to March

Woolly foxglove
(*Pityrodia axillaris*)



Habitat Shrubland on sandplain, in recently disturbed areas
Description A shrub 15 to 30 centimetres tall
Flowering time August to October

Recurved wattle
(*Acacia recurvata*)



Habitat Creeklines, plains, breakaways and low hills
Description A shrub 0.6 to 2.5 metres tall
Flowering time July

Silky frankenia
(*Frankenia conferta*)



Habitat Saline flats or edges of salt lakes
Description A small shrub
Flowering time October to November
