## Questions and answers

### Why are you no longer printing the magazine?

The market for printed magazines has changed and the costs associated with producing a printed publication are no longer sustainable. Reducing our reliance on paper plays a crucial role in environmental conservation, a value that is held dearly by the *LANDSCOPE* team. Transitioning to an online format allows us to share stories to a wider audience.

We recognise that some of our loyal subscribers will be disappointed that a hardcopy volume is no longer available, and we confess we are also a little saddened by this. However, we believe the benefits of a digital publication outweigh the disadvantages.

### When will the last edition of *LANDSCOPE* be printed?

Winter 2025 will be the last printed edition of *LANDSCOPE* magazine. From Spring 2025 onwards, the same rich content will be available for you to read and enjoy for free from your digital devices.

### What will remain the same:

- Each edition will feature the same number of well-written, well-researched articles on the same variety of topics.
- *LANDSCOPE* will still be issued quarterly.
- Articles will still undergo the same level of rigorous scientific checks and approvals.
- Articles will still be complemented by audio visual elements including videos and podcast episodes.

### What will change:

- Instead of receiving a printed copy in the mail, you will receive an email. The email will contain links to articles contained within the current edition of *LANDSCOPE*.
- The content will be available anytime. Previous editions and articles will be archived on the DBCA website and can be readily accessed.

### What about my subscription?

Customers can purchase partial subscriptions for the two remaining printed editions until 28 February 2025.

### How will I receive my magazine after Winter 2025?

If you have provided your email address, we will send you an email in the coming months confirming your free online subscription so you can continue to enjoy uninterrupted delivery of *LANDSCOPE* directly to your inbox.

Each edition will arrive as an email with links to each article on the DBCA website. Readers can also search past articles, videos and, listen to podcast episodes.
