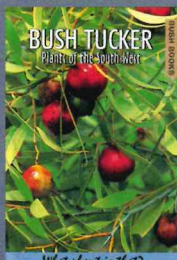
Common Birds of the South-West Forests

Jeemuluk

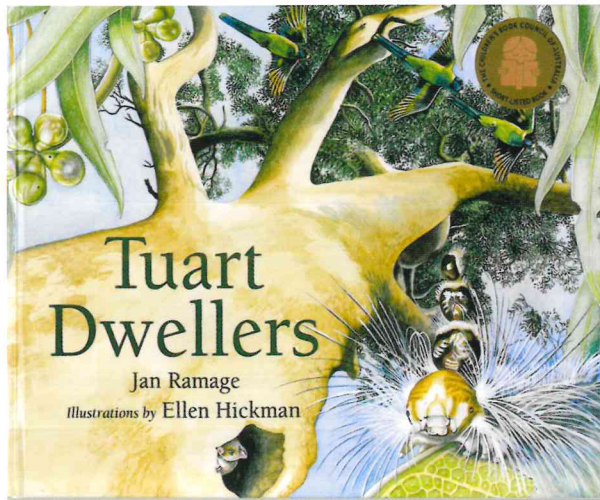

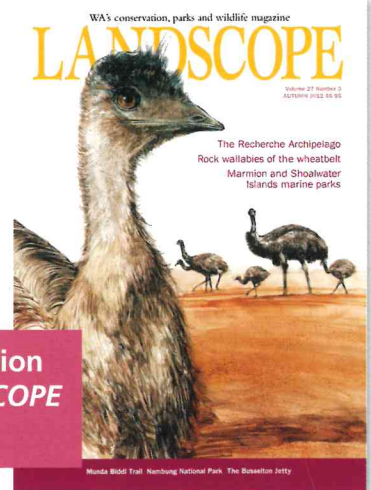
