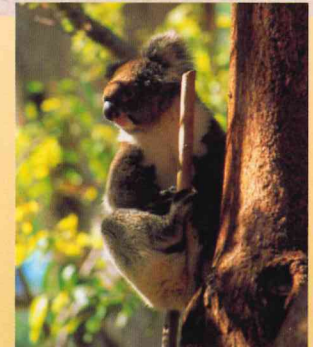
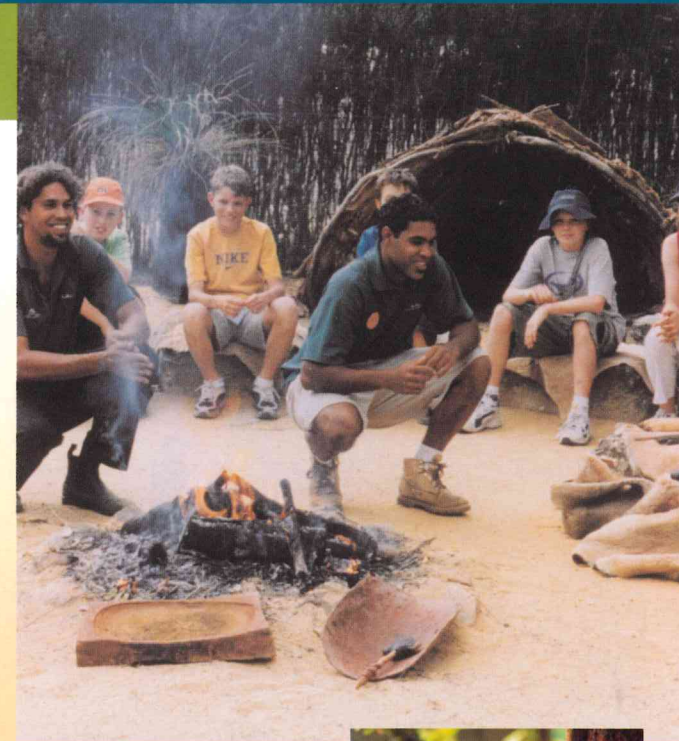
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Yanchep National Park

animal allsorts

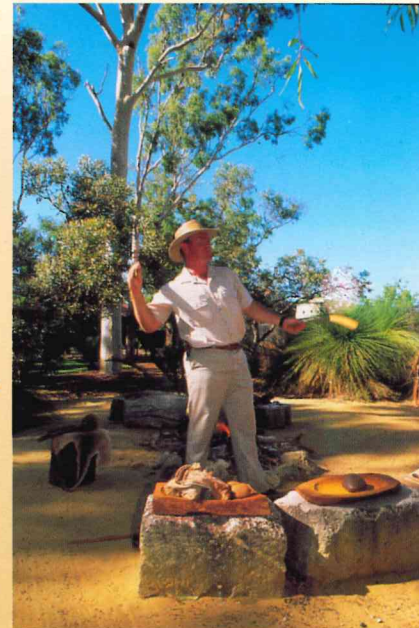
Discover the principles of classification in this activity that looks at the way we sort animals into groups. The wild animals of Yanchep National Park provide the subjects.

WET TO WOOD

Learn more about animal adaptations to different habitats such as wetlands and woodlands. This activity will also encourage a greater appreciation for local wildlife.

SPEAR AND BOOMERANG THROWING

Get a feel of what it's like to throw a 'gidge' (spear) or 'kylee' (boomerang), Nyoongar style.

Tracks and Scats

Learn how Aboriginal people know what is happening in the bush. Track animals by following their prints or scats, hearing their sounds and knowing their characteristics.

DIDGE AND DANCE

Join in for a dance lesson with a difference. Learn some traditional dances like the "Watta ma" and while catching your breath, listen to some of the enchanting sounds of the didgeridoo.

ARE KOALAS BORING?

Aspects of koala ecology and behaviour are examined in this activity aimed at demonstrating how animals have adapted to their environment.

NYOONGAR Camp Life

Students visit our Balga Mia (Nyoongar Camp) with one of our Aboriginal guides and learn about traditional Nyoongar lifestyles.
