❖ Easy access for people with disabilities.



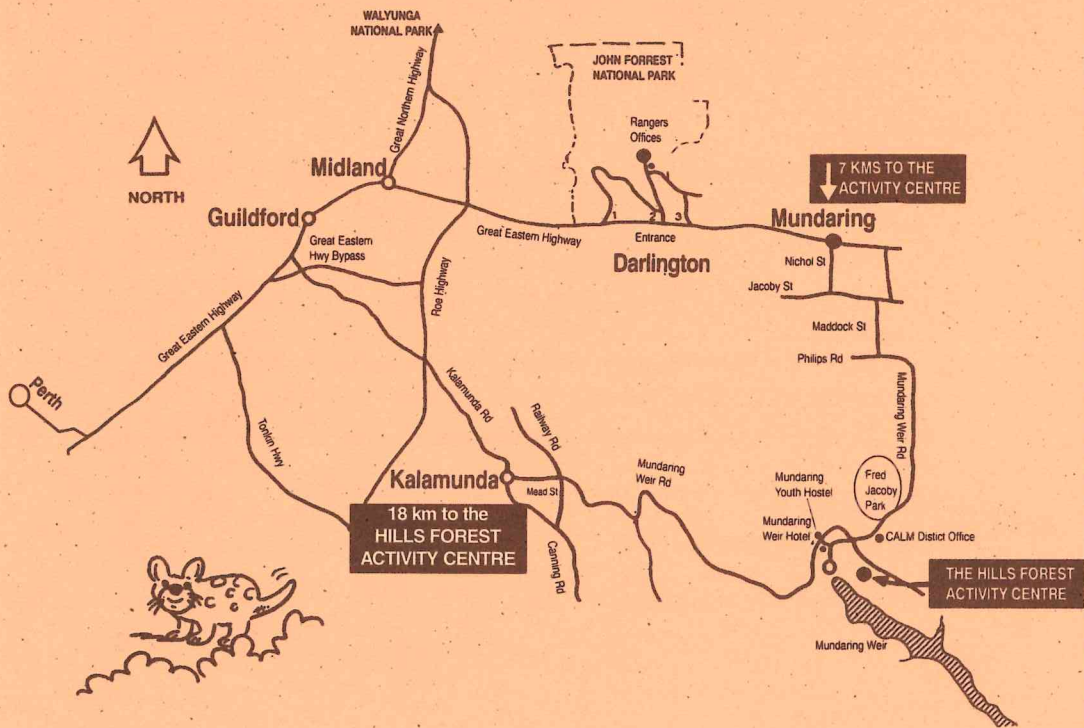
