

1 Chainsaw Competency

Date: Saturday & Sunday 22–23 August Cost: \$180 Instructor: Tom Wood

Gain competency in maintenance, cutting techniques and personal safety using a chainsaw — an essential but potentially dangerous tool. This is an accredited training course which will improve your skills for the safe collecting of wood and could even enhance job prospects.

2 Furniture Restoration and Timber Finishing

Date: Saturday & Sunday 22-23 August

Cost: \$180 Instructor: Chris Brown

Sick of looking at that old chest of drawers in your shed . . . the one with peeling white paint and sticky drawers? Alternatively you may have made something you wish to finish. Bring along your own small piece of furniture or woodwork and learn how to expertly restore and finish it. Chris will supervise and demonstrate the skills required to you and the rest of the group.

3 Joinery for Fine Woodwork 1

Date: Saturday & Sunday 29–30 August

Cost: \$180 Instructor: John Fitzgerald

Make an elegant hardwood shelving unit with drawer that is suitable for a number of purposes. At the same time learn to use and maintain hand tools. Common joining techniques will include trenching, rebating, and dovetail joints.

Participants should note that this workshop is not a prerequisite to Joinery 2.

4 Wood Sculpturing/Portrait Carving

Date: Saturday 5 September

Cost: \$90 Instructor: Beauchamp Paine

Award-winning carver Beauchamp Paine will lead participants through the process of portrait carving using only the simplest of tools. Participants will be amazed at the effective teaching process that is used and the lifelike qualities of the portraits produced.

5 Timber Drying

Date: Saturday 5 September

Cost: \$60 Instructor: Ian Rotheram

Got a dry sense of humour? Learn the science of timber drying. This is a must for those interested in collecting, drying and storing their own timber.

6 Inlays and Marquetry

Date: Saturday & Sunday 12–13 September Cost: \$180 Instructor: Martin White

Learn the intricacies and decorative potential of these traditional techniques that will enable you to embellish your future designs.

7 Woodturning Intermediate

Date: Saturday & Sunday 12–13 September Cost: \$190 Instructor: Gordon Ward

You've 'had a go'; now you have the basics and want to do more. Learn techniques such as deep hollowing, larger bowls, goblet turning and undercut rims.

8 Wood Carving

Date: Saturday & Sunday 19–20 September Cost: \$180 Instructor: Jenny Scrayen

Jenny is well known for her work on the Endeavour Project and will lead participants in a creative carving project of their choice.



10 Bush Furniture

Date: Saturday & Sunday 10-11 October

Cost: \$180 Instructor: Pieter Baarspul

Don't burn it! Come and let Pieter show you how to transform would-be firewood into beautiful, functional bush furniture.

11 Veneering

Date: Saturday & Sunday 17-18 October

Cost: \$180 Instructor: Malcolm Harris

Make a beautiful coffee table with steam-bent legs whilst exploring the range of veneering processes and pattern matching techniques of this historical, conservative craft.

12 Pyrography (Hot Poker work!)

Date: Saturday 24 October

Cost: \$90 Instructor: Steve Makin

This one-day course introduces participants to the basics of pyrography and be able to embellish some of their own items (turned items, carvings, furniture) or create an artistic piece from scratch.

13 Catch up Day!

These are for participants who have completed a previous workshop but may not have completed their project. We'll supply an "all rounder" who will supervise participants in completing their projects.

14 Joinery for Fine Woodwork 2

Date: Saturday & Sunday 31 Oct-1 November

Learn mortice and tenon joins, rebating and shaping to make a frame; e.g. mirror, pinup board, picture. etc. At the same time learn to use and maintain hand tools.

Participants should note that this workshop is not linked to **Joinery 1**.

15 Routering

Cost: \$180 Instructor: Tom O'Donnell

Improve your productivity with the router. Tom will lead participants through a series of demonstrations and activities, which include inserting hinges and catches, mortice and tenon joins, table/chair legs and backs, and much more.

16 Shoji Screens

Make a shoji screen suitable for lamps, windows and doors using traditional Japanese techniques and tools. Phillippe has lived and worked in Japan and is keen to pass on his knowledge to work shop participants.

Date: Saturdays & Sundays 21, 22, 28, 29 November (4-day workshop)


Cost: \$360 Instructor: Rene Raulin

Push your skills to the limit. Practise deep hollowing, "knots" and embellishment of bowls with a master turner.

Enrolment Details

Registration is first-come, first-served. Full payment must accompany registration forms. Confirmation of course enrolment will be forwarded to you within 21 days.

Minimum age for participants is 16 years.

Materials and machinery required for the workshops are supplied unless otherwise directed. Participants are encouraged to bring along their own tools.

Cancellation: Notification of cancellation must be given at least 21 days prior to the workshop. 14 days prior incurs a 50% penalty and 7 days prior a 100% penalty of fees.

Location

Dwellingup is located in the Murray Shire, 20 minutes inland from Pinjarra and 45 minutes from Mandurah on the coast

Accommodation is available at the Old Forestry Cadet School, which adjoins the Forest Heritage Centre. This facility offers simple but comfortable heated single rooms with shared cooking, toilet and recreational facilities. Please bring along linen, warm bedding, pillow, towel and food for the weekend. Meals are available at the local hotel and restaurant if required. Cost for one night's accommodation for School of Wood participants is \$10.
