

On the eastern side of the city visit the Army Museum then find out what's new in the arts at the Arts Centre. Next door, step back in time and see the exhibits at the Fremantle History Museum. Travel south along Ord Street to the Prison Complex, housing the Children's Literature Centre, Francis Burt Law Education Centre and the Prison buildings themselves.

Towards the centre of town the World of Energy is at the cutting edge of renewable energy and technology, while across the road, education in all its forms is highlighted at the Education Centre. Next door, the world of moving pictures is now showing at the Film and Television Institute. By the Town Hall, board a Fremantle Tram and take a trip around the city.

Near the railway station, Spare Parts Puppet Theatre invites you to discover the mysteries of puppetry, while the harbour is home to the Historic Boats Museum.

Travelling south, past the Round House and historic Bathers Beach, other maritime themes are explored at the Duyfken Replica Foundation and the WA Maritime Museum. Around the corner WA's unique flora and fauna are on view at CALM's WA Naturally display, while across the road in the Moores Building you are welcome to view one of the many contemporary arts events.
