Every purchase of a fine wood piece is an investment in the future of the fine wood industry in Western Australia.


Orders are also taken for commissioned pieces.

Dwellingup is an historic timber town nestled in the jarrah forest, only 20 minutes inland from Pinjarra, 40 minutes from Mandurah and an easy 90-minute drive from Perth.

FOREST HERITAGE CENTRE

The Forest Heritage Centre brings the jarrah forest to life. The unique leaf-shaped building houses the Forest Heritage Gallery in addition to displays that bring the forest to life, and WA's only specialist school of wood where you can meet designer/makers at work.

Outside, you can walk among the tops of trees on the forest canopy walk, wander along magical forest trails, or explore a traditional Aboriginal mia mia and early timber getter's hut.

To really get away and enjoy the forest, accommodation is available at the Jarrah Forest Lodge, which is part of the Forest Heritage Centre.

A range of day and weekend courses, using the excellent facilities of the School of Wood are also available. Please ask for course details.
