



Some Wildflowers of Western Australia's **National Parks**

Western Australia occupies about one-third of the continent, extending from the northern tropics to the temperate south-west. Its vegetation ranges from high forests to desert. The variety of form and colour of the wildflowers of the state is bewildering. Take for example, the grotesque

Boabab tree, or the magnificent Karri and compare them with the dainty orchids and the intriguing Kangaroo Paws.
