

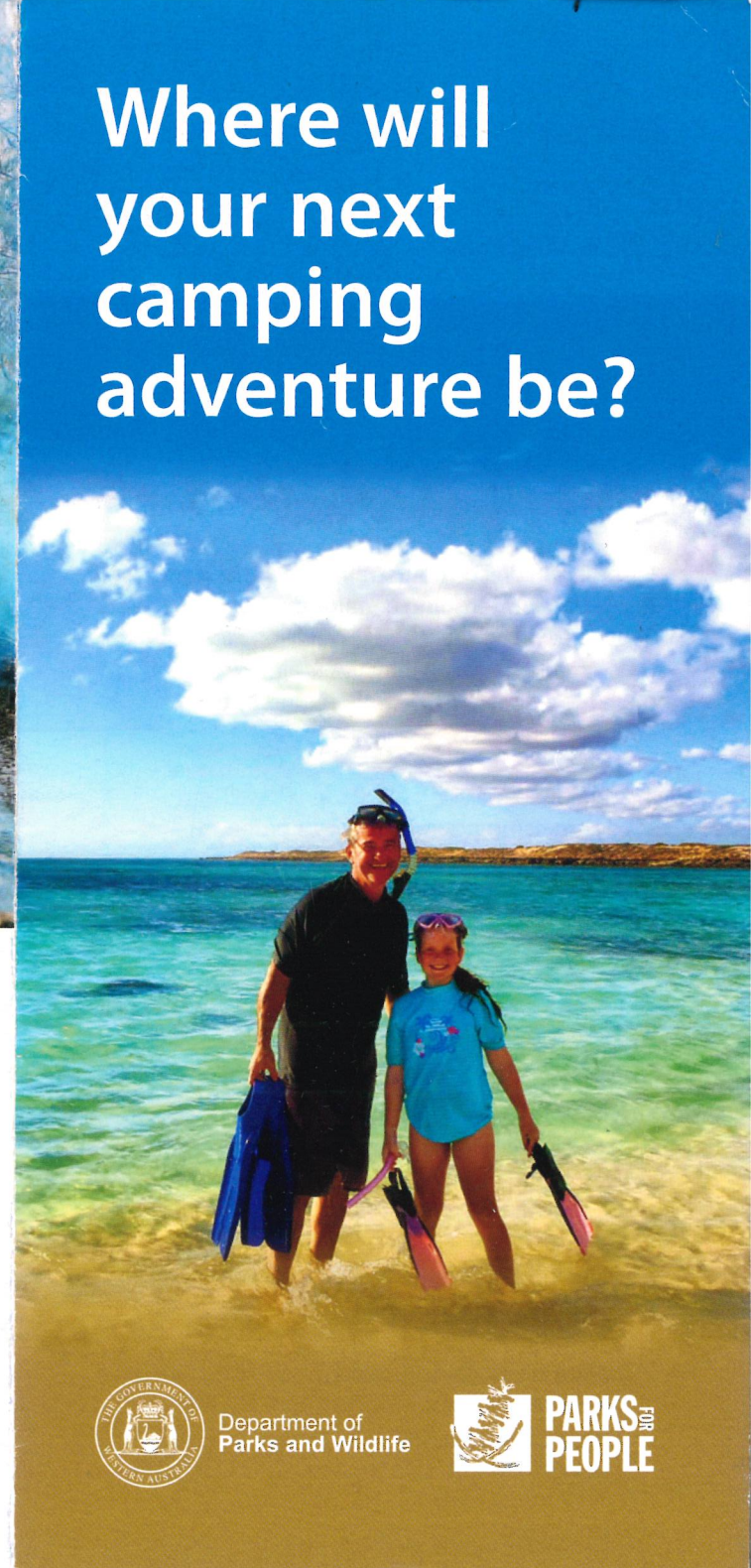

### Camping in Western Australia's national parks and reserves is undergoing a major upgrade.

The State Government's \$21.05 million *Parks for People* Caravan and Camping initiative is aimed at creating more high-quality, low-cost camping options in national parks and reserves.

In addition to Martins Tank, Baden Powell and Kurrajong campgrounds, new campgrounds and upgrades are underway for campers and caravanners to enjoy.

- **Nanga Brook Campground** (Lane Poole Reserve) will be expanded to 41 camp sites. OPEN.
- **Conto Campground** (Leeuwin-Naturaliste National Park) will be expanded to 118 camp sites. OPEN.
- **Osprey Campground** (Cape Range National Park) is being expanded to 45 camp sites. OPEN for Easter.
- **Black Point Campground** (D'Entrecasteaux National Park) will be expanded to 29 camp sites. OPEN.
- **Gnaala Mia Campground** (Dryandra Woodland) is a new campground with 30 camp sites. OPEN July 2015.
- **Miners Campground** (Coalseam Conservation Park) will be upgraded and expanded to 25 camp sites. OPEN.
- **Logue Brook Campground** (Clarke forest block) is a new campground with 130 camp sites. OPEN.
- **Credo Campground** (Credo Station) is a new campground with 16 camp sites. OPEN July 2015.
