

#### **District Allowance rate increase**

The District Allowance rates for all occupational groups have been increased and updated in the Alesco Human Resources System. The effective date is Wednesday 1 July 2009.

Arrears payments have been automatically calculated and paid to employees in pay 14, Thursday 7 January 2010.

#### Frontline Management Training for regional staff

A leadership development program has commenced for a pilot group of 20 staff. The program has a regional focus with most of the participants coming from: Kimberley, Wheatbelt, Pilbara, Mid West and the Goldfields regions.

DEC has partnered with an external training provider, MODAL, to provide the Certificate IV qualification in Frontline Management.

The program will be a combination of workshops, video conferencing, practical workplace applications, a workplace improvement project, coaching and assessment.

This training has been made possible because of funding under the Federal Government's Productivity Places Program (via the WA Department of Education and Training). It is hoped that, with additional funding, another group will commence mid year.

# Public Service Holiday in Lieu (PSHIL) information reminder for employees covered by the PSGA and GOSAC awards

- Permanent full time employees are entitled to only two PSHIL days per year.
- Depending on the employees roster part time employees are entitled to one or two days PSHIL days.
- A contract employee is credited the PSHIL days that fall within their contract period.

For permanent and part-time employees the Public Service Holidays in Lieu do not accrue from one year to the next.

The Alesco HR System will automatically clear any remaining balances and credit where applicable the two Public Service Holidays in Lieu on 1 January each year.

The PSHIL for contract staff are manually updated in Alesco by Workforce Services Officers.
