People Services' regional training

Members of the Organisational Learning and Development (OLD) team have recently completed all but one of the Regional Services' training sessions on:

- accountable and ethical decision-making in the public sector
- employee performance development program (EPDP)
- managing performance issues.

In 2010 the roll-out has seen OLD visit over 20 regional offices (plus some metropolitan offices) and present the training to more than 800 staff.

We are currently developing online learning and participant booklets that can be provided to staff who missed the sessions and for new staff.

The training will be continued to be rolled out to metropolitan staff later this year.

Keeping track with VETtrak!

Organisational Learning and Development (OLD) have recently implemented a departmental training management database that will allow all training and development data to sit on one centralised data system. VETtrak will allow:

- the ability to plan and prompt refresher training for certificates such as first aid, firearms licenses and environmental/conservation authorisations
- timely and efficient reporting on training trends and mapping future training needs
- training scheduling and recording for all accredited training
- staff to access their qualifications and training history through employee kiosk which will allow them to actively map out their professional development and career aspirations.

OLD have been busy entering all existing departmental data into VETtrak. This is an enormous job, therefore all data is currently been entered using a 'staged' approach starting with all accredited training.

September will see OLD investigate online enrolment forms (DEC90s). Online enrolment forms will allow staff to enroll into a nominated course at the click of a button, making the process far more efficient.
