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INTRODUCTION

This is a summary of Training Courses available to staff of the Department of Conservation and Land Management. Included in this publication is a Training Calendar for the period 1 July 1986 to June 1987, and a set of course outlines.

The Training Calendar (Part 1) is a month by month statement of those courses which are planned to be conducted at specific times throughout the year. Page numbers have been provided in Part 1, for easy identification of courses in Part 2.

The Catalogue is divided into two sections. The first section (Part 2) contains course outlines for those courses which will be conducted at specific times throughout the year. The second section (Appendices) contains course outlines for courses which are available on demand. These training courses will be programmed as the need arises.

This publication should not be considered definitive. Further courses may be added, and amendments made to courses programmed.

Officers proposing additional courses should:-

- 1. Establish the need for training.
- 2. Programme such a course so that it does not conflict with other courses in the Training Calendar.
- Arrange for financial and other resources.
- 4. Complete a Course Proposal Form (819) as described in Circular 6/85, and forward to Training Officer A. Brandis at Regional Office, Bunbury.

Amendments to the course calendar should be forwarded to Training Officer A. Brandis, Bunbury.

A Co-ordinating Officer and a conducting officer have been identified for many of the courses. The responsibility for the management of each course should be shared by these two officers.

Responsibilities of the Co-ordinating Officer are:-

- 1. To appoint a conducting officer.
- To provide a course programme.
- 3. Make all administrative arrangements including accommodation.
- 4. Arrange lectures, course materials.
- 5. Call for nominations, and select participants.

- 6. Distribute joining instructions to all participants copy to A. Brandis at Bunbury.
- 7. At the completion of the course, return forms 820 and 794 to Training Officer A. Brandis at Bunbury.

Responsibility of the Conducting Officer:-

- 1. To assist the Co-ordinating Officer.
- 2. To attend the entire course in order to ensure the smooth running of the course.

Responsibility of Training Section Staff:-

- Assist the Co-ordinating Officer in any training aspects of the course, e.g. establishing specific learning objectives, identification of level of knowledge of participants, strategies of teaching, measurement and evaluation.
- 2. Before the course proceeds, demarcate financial responsibilities.

The Training Calendar and Course Outlines presented here are essentially those courses which are applicable to the Department, and will proceed for more than one day. It is not intended that local training by Regions and Districts should be inhibited in any way.

Regional, District, and Branch Managers should ensure that this publication is circulated to all staff. Any staff who are unable to attend a course due to limitations in the number of participants, or financial constraints, should use the Staff Appraisal procedure to discuss with their O.I.C. their future participation in similar courses.
