Ground Parrous

Some members of FRNPA have spend several evenings and mornings (one hour perore sundise is very early at this time of the year) listending for Ground Parrots (Pezoporus Wallicus) to help with a six month survey to be finished by November 1984.

The aim of the survey was to discover how plentiful ground parrous are in W.A. and where they are located. Searching has been done from Augusta to Cape Arid at the coast and inland. In places they had previously been seen and other likely places.

So far less yhan 30 birds have been found in five populations Of these 1 population was in FRNP and 3 in north Fitzgerald area.

Windcheaters and Teeshirts There was an excellent response to the sale of these garments which added considerably to our funds. New supplies of these as well as teatowels are now available.


