

### **Preface**

This report records progress in the creation of conservation reserves in accordance with the Environmental Protection Authority Red Book recommendations published in four reports released between 1976 and 1984. A more detailed history appears in Section 3, Background of this report.

This status report consolidates information on the evolution of the system of conservation reserves, the policies that guide their creation and the roles of Government agencies in the process.

The information is provided mainly in the form of an extensive table in which each Red Book recommendation and part recommendation is identified and summarised.

The commentary in the table identifies key issues to be resolved before some recommendations can be implemented. It gives current interpretations of recommendations that may have been affected by changes to legislation, responsible management agencies or Government policy since the Red Books were released.

Of necessity, information is provided in summary form. The comments are not detailed but are intended to give an accurate overview. The information is accurate at the time of the report's preparation, though some of the issues covered are constantly changing.

Comments or requests for clarification should be directed to the Environmental Protection Authority.

This report deals only with the status of Environmental Protection Authority Red Book recommendations. New conservation reserve proposals, such as those developed by the Department of Conservation and Land Management through its regional planning process, have been included only if they represent updates of existing Red Book recommendations.

### Introduction

One of the first actions taken by the Environmental Protection Authority after its formation in 1971 was to establish a committee to review and make recommendations to the Authority on the adequacy of existing reserves and proposals for additional national parks and nature reserves in Western Australia; the Conservation Through Reserves Committee (CTRC).

The committee divided the State into 12 geographic systems as the basis for its review, called for public comments on the existing reserve system and new proposals, and considered the public submissions in its review. It reported to the Environmental Protection Authority in 1974 on all but System 6 (greater Perth and Darling Range region) and System 7 (Kimberley); these two were considered separately with the System 7 report received in 1978 and System 6 in 1981. These reports which were printed in green covers became known as the Green Books.

The Environmental Protection Authority in turn called for public comments on each of the CTRC Green Books and reviewed these submissions before making its own recommendations to Government in a series of four reports, from 1976 to 1984. These reports in red covers came to be widely known as the Environmental Protection Authority Red Books, and the recommendations they contained, the Red Book recommendations.

The first two Red Books received unqualified endorsement by Government in February and October 1976 respectively. The System 7 recommendations were released in September 1981 and were accepted by Government as a guide for the establishment of conservation reserves in the Kimberley. In March 1984, the Government accepted the general principles of the System 6 Red Book and approved of the progressive implementation of the locality specific recommendations as far as possible.

# 1. Summary - Status of implementation and future directions

The Environmental Protection Authority 'Red Book' recommendations for conservation reserves in Western Australia were endorsed and released in four reports from 1976 to 1984, (the 'Red Books'). The recommendations have been implemented progressively since 1976. While the Department of Conservation and Land Management is progressively developing additional proposals for conservation reserves through its regional planning process, the Environmental Protection Authority Red Book recommendations currently remain the main focus of the Government's proposed additions to the State's conservation estate. Similarly in the metropolitan region, even though the Department of Planning and Urban Development is progressively acquiring additional public open space for conservation/recreation purposes, the System 6 recommendations remain the primary focus for the proposed conservation estate.

The conservation reserve system in Western Australia includes national parks, nature reserves, conservation parks and other reserves for conservation /recreation vested in the National Parks and Nature Conservation Authority. In addition there are some 1.15 million ha of coastal waters reserved as marine parks and marine nature reserves, almost all of which are derived from Red Book proposals. This system of parks and reserves currently covers some 7% of the State.

Although not regarded as part of the primary conservation reserve system, a number of recommendations particularly in the metropolitan region of System 6 relate to bushland reserves vested with local authorities, the Water Authority of WA or Management Boards (eg Kings Park Board, Rottnest Island Authority), which can be of major regional significance for conservation and recreation purposes. Similarly, the extensive State Forest and timber reserves in the South West and Goldfields have considerable values for conservation, recreation and water production and play an integral in the conservation of the forest environments.

Since the Red Books were released the total area of the primary conservation estate has more than doubled, from less than 8 million hectares to about 17.4 million hectares.

Implementation of the Red Book recommendations has proceeded with renewed impetus over the last two years under the Resolution of Conflict policy (November 1990), which addresses mining and conservation interactions, the System 6 Co-ordinating Committee and Ecoplan initiatives for the metropolitan region, and with the notable reservation of the Shark Bay Marine Park/Marine Nature Reserve recommendations, as updated by the Shark Bay Region Plan.

During this period approximately 1 450 000 ha has been added to the conservation reserve system, including:

- Shark Bay Marine Park and Marine Nature Reserve (748 735 ha, Shark Bay World Heritage Area)
- Mt Lesueur National Park (27 500 ha)
- D'Entrecasteaux National Park additions (79 671 ha)
- Kennedy Ranges National Park (141 660 ha)
- François Peron National Park (52 528 ha, Shark Bay World Heritage Area)
- False Mouths of the Ord Nature Reserve (55 897 ha, addition to Ord River Nature reserve)
- Parry Lagoon Nature Reserve (36 000 ha including consolidation of existing reserves)
- Montebello Islands Conservation Park (about 2000 ha including intertidal areas)
- Boranup Karri forest, added to the Leeuwin-Naturaliste National Park (3207 ha)
- John Forrest National Park (1 168 ha addition, almost doubling its size)
- Yeal Nature Reserve (10 357 ha)
- Coomallo Nature Reserve (8 815 ha)
- Yellowdine Nature Reserve (32 798 ha)
- Gingin and Boonanarring Brooks Nature Reserve (9 250 ha)

- De La Poer Range Nature Reserve (74 935 ha)
- Creation of the Lane-Poole and Dale Conservation Parks

In addition the Department of Planning and Urban Development has released final plans for the establishment of a number of Regional Parks including:

- · Canning River Regional Park;
- · Beeliar Regional Park; and
- Yellagonga Regional Park.

Local authorities in the metropolitan region have also been progressing the Red Book recommendations by preparing and implementing management plans for a number of System 6 areas with recent initiatives including plans for:

- Mary Carrol Park;
- · Lake Gwelup;
- · Lake Claremont;
- · Point Resolution; and
- · Cantonment Hill.

A summary of the implementation status of the Red Book systems is presented in Table 1.

Implementation of the recommendations in most systems defined in the Environmental Protection Authority Red Books has now proceeded to an advanced stage (>70% implemented) and in some systems implementation is close to complete. The major exceptions are Systems 6 and 7, which are 35-45% implemented.

In implementing any set of recommendations affecting the use and management of a significant proportion of the State, challenges requiring the resolution of a range of competing interests in the land must be expected. This has been the experience in implementing the Environmental Protection Authority Red Book recommendations. Progress since the recommendations received Government endorsement has generally been slow and steady after the initial successes in implementing the more readily resolvable recommendations.

To a significant degree the rate of progress has also been influenced by changing public attitudes and Government policies associated with issues such as mining in conservation reserves, and an increasing awareness of Aboriginal land interests.

Changes in departmental responsibilities have also had a significant bearing on the evolution of the recommendations. The amalgamation of the Forests Department, National Parks Authority and Wildlife section from the former Department of Fisheries and Wildlife, to form the Department of Conservation and Land Management has been particularly significant. The establishment of this department facilitated the development of a true conservation reserve system in the forest regions, and through the CALM Act it became a statutory requirement for the department and the National Parks and Nature Conservation Authority to prepare public management plans for reserve lands vested in the Authority.

The Resolution of Conflict policy introduced in November 1990 has provided a framework for resolving the stalemate between conservation and mining interests, previously a major constraint on the establishment of conservation reserves other than those in the System 6 metropolitan region.

Moreover, in accordance with the policy the Department of Minerals and Energy WA now treats all outstanding Environmental Protection Authority Red Book Recommendations as Class C nature reserves in relation to mining access.

Mining interest remains an issue in relation to the establishment of national parks in areas considered to be prospective for mining, as does petroleum prospectivity in areas proposed as marine parks or marine nature reserves. The ban on petroleum drilling in marine parks and marine nature reserves established by the Resolution of Conflict policy has been clarified in the Marine Parks Policy for WA (1992).

Under the Resolution of Conflict policy framework a co-ordinated and co-operative approach has been established by the Environmental Protection Authority and the departments of Conservation and Land Management, Minerals and Energy, and Land Administration in progressing recommendations for implementation. The level of co-operation achieved between the mining and the conservation/environment arms of Government in this area is an important advance that was not previously possible.

Now that the reserve implementation constraints associated with mining issues have been reduced, the principal challenge in System 7, the region with the lowest proportion of implemented recommendations, is to find acceptable means of addressing Aboriginal interests in traditional lands and the protection of cultural values. This issue is particularly sensitive in this region because of claims for traditional native title over a substantial area that includes a number of Red Book recommendations. The High Court decision on the Mabo case suggests that national parks do not extinguish native title because they may be considered to be consistent with continuing concurrent enjoyment of native title over the land.

The other system with a high proportion of unimplemented recommendations is System 6. The major issues which have made implementation of locality specific System 6 recommendations difficult, in the metropolitan region in particular, have been dealing with the concept of regional parks which included land of mixed ownership (public and private); achieving conservation

objectives on private lands; achieving agreement on reserve vesting and management responsibilities; and resolving issues of access to resources (eg limestone, gravel) of concern to some local authorities.

Nevertheless many of the recommendations of the System 6 Red Book have been implemented since its release in 1983, particularly through the efforts of a number of agencies including many local authorities, the departments of Planning and Urban Development, Conservation and Land Management and Land Administration and the Environmental Protection Authority, with support from many community groups.

Over the past year System 6 has received priority attention by the Environmental Protection Authority in association with key Government agencies including the departments of Planning and Urban Development, Conservation and Land Management, and Land Administration as well as the WA Municipal Association and the Conservation Council of WA. These organisations have a co-ordinated work programme to expedite implementation of the System 6 recommendations in the metropolitan region, beginning with the recommendations considered to have fewer constraints to implementation.

More recently the departments of Conservation and Land Management and Planning and Urban Development have agreed on a co-ordinated programme for the establishment of regional parks, a concept raised by the System 6 study and recommended for application over significant parts of the region. The programme has been considered by Government, and decisions made to facilitate on-going establishment of regional parks. Under the arrangement regional parks will include lands with a wide range of tenure and uses and will provide a framework within which many of the System 6 recommendations could be implemented.

The priority for System 6 will continue into 1993 and is assisted by community involvement through Ecoplan which fosters public ownership of System 6 areas. Ecoplan involves schools and community groups 'adopting' and caring for their local System 6 area and working with local authorities and Government departments which have statutory responsibility for these areas.

# 2. Objectives for reserve implementation over next two years

The following represent the targets that the Environmental Protection Authority would expect to achieve in the implementation of the outstanding Red Book Recommendations over the next two years in co-operation with State and local government agencies.

As any reading of this report will indicate, a large number of variables can influence the success in implementing recommendations.

Priority attention over the two year period will be given to lifting implementation in the System 6 and System 7 regions which currently have the lowest proportion of successfully implemented recommendations.

## 2.1 System 6

In the System 6 metropolitan region priority will be given to implementing the Government's recent decision to create a new category of land known as a regional park under the CALM Act and to formulate procedures for the allocation of funding to specific park areas. Attention will also be given to finalising reservation of areas in the Beeliar Regional Park and Leda areas, and to completing the regional park planning studies for the Darling Range and Gnangara wetlands. Encouragement will be given to local authorities and State Government agencies to prepare management plans for System 6 areas already within their control. The Environmental Protection Authority is also liaising with the Commonwealth Government to seek an effective mechanism to achieve the intent of those recommendations in Commonwealth Government owned lands.

The priority in the System 6 country region will be to finalise the proposed conservation reserves in the forest regions. The prospects are good that most proposals, apart from some recommendations covered by Special Agreement Act areas with proven resources, could be reserved. Parliamentary approval for revocation of the State forest areas will be required to permit reservation. This legal requirement has proved to be a cause of delays in the past.

### **2.2 System 7**

Priority attention during the next two years will also be focused on the implementation of recommendations in System 7. One of the highest priorities for achieving success in this region is the development of an agreed framework for addressing Aboriginal interests in conservation reserves. While the priority for this is highest in the Kimberley, from the perspective of reserve implementation, the issue is also of importance around the State for on-going reserve management.

Progress in reserve implementation in the Kimberley is difficult to predict. However, if the challenges associated with these issues can be resolved, considerable progress could be expected that would substantially improve management of both conservation and cultural values. Early resolution of these issues could see implementation of the Red Book recommendations approach the level of implementation achieved for most other Systems within two years.

### 2.3 Other Systems

Implementation of recommendations in the other Systems is more advanced and will be the focus of on-going efforts to implement priority recommendations.

If an agreed approach to Aboriginal interests can be achieved, it would improve the prospects for implementation of recommendation areas in a number of other systems, notably System 12. The priority for implementation of recommendations in Systems 2 and 3, will focus on the recommendations developed by Environmental Protection Authority South Coast working groups and subsequently picked up in the CALM South Coast Region Management Plan, and reservation of proposed additions to the Fitzgerald River National Park and the Ravensthorpe Range areas.

During the next two years it is proposed to progressively implement recommendations in these systems at least to Class C reserve status, so that only a residue of very difficult recommendations involving major conflicts with other interests or requiring the opportunistic acquisition of land as it comes up for sale might remain.

# 3.Background

# 3.1 Environmental Protection Authority Red Books - origin and development

One of the first actions taken by the Environmental Protection Authority after its formation in 1971 was to appoint the Conservation Through Reserves Committee (CTRC) to review and make recommendations to the Authority on the adequacy of existing reserves and proposals for additional national parks and nature reserves in Western Australia.

The full terms of reference of the CTRC were;

"• to review and update the 1962 recommendations of a subcommittee of the Australian Academy of Science (WA) with respect to National Parks and Nature Reserves of the State;

- to review National Parks and other significant reserves controlled by the (then) National Parks Board of WA and the Pemberton National Parks Board, and large wildlife sanctuaries controlled by the (then) WA Wildlife Authority;
- to review areas recommended to the Minister for Lands by the Reserves Advisory Council; and
- to consider proposals for reserves submitted to it in writing by interested members of the public and organisations and by Local Authorities and State and Commonwealth Government instrumentalities."

The CTRC divided the State into twelve regions (referred to as Systems) and reviewed reserve needs and public comments in each system. Its first report (printed in green covers and known as the the CTRC Green Book) which addressed all systems other than the region around Perth (System 6) and the Kimberley (System 7), was released for public comment in 1974. The Kimberley region was treated separately because of its remoteness and the need for additional information. The CTRC Green Book for System 7 was released for comment in 1978. A more intensive review process was used for System 6 because of the greater range and complexity of land-use interests and closer subdivision of this region. The System 6 Green Book was released for public comment in 1981.

The Environmental Protection Authority considered each of the CTRC recommendations, together with all comments and submissions and other available information before making its own recommendations to Government in a series of four reports, from 1976 to 1984. Many of the CTRC recommendations were endorsed, some were amended and others were rejected.

The Environmental Protection Authority reports became known as the 'Red Books' because of their red covers and the recommendations they contained came to be widely known as the Environmental Protection Authority 'Red Book' recommendations.

The first two Red Books, for Systems 4, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 and Systems 1, 2, 3 and 5, received unqualified endorsement by Government in February and October 1976 respectively. The System 7 recommendations were released in September 1981 and were accepted by Government, as a guide for the establishment of conservation reserves in the Kimberley. In March 1984, the Government accepted the general principles of the System 6 Red Book and approved of the progressive implementation of the locality specific recommendations as far as possible.

In the early years following their release major progress was made in the implementation of the Environmental Protection Authority Red Book recommendations. However, as the more readily resolvable recommendations were implemented, leaving those with significant competing interests to be addressed, and as issues such as mining in conservation reserves and an increasing awareness of Aboriginal land interests came to the fore during the 1980's the rate of progress slowed.

In the mid 1980's success was achieved in resolving mining and conservation issues preventing the reservation of a number of significant proposed reserves in the Darling Range that were within the lease area subject to the Alumina Refinery Act (1961) with Alcoa. A Reserves Review Committee comprising relevant Government agencies, industry and conservation groups was established. The committee reviewed and agreed on revised reserve purposes and boundaries within Alcoa Mineral Lease 1SA. This work formed the basis for a number of the 1987 CALM Forest Region Management Plan proposals and resulted in the establishment of the Lane-Poole and Monadnocks Reserves, and an extensive addition to Serpentine National Park.

Following the release of the 'Balancing the Scales' policy in 1988, a 'Red Book Task Force' was formed to facilitate implementation of the remaining Environmental Protection Authority recommendations within the framework established by the policy for addressing the conservation reserve/mineral resource interactions.

The Red Book Task Force, which involved all government agencies with a role in reserve implementation and ran for about two years was only partially successful. It achieved limited success with further reserve implementation, and contributed to a substantial improvement in the information base, notably on mineral resource and Aboriginal interests in proposed reserves, which has been of lasting value. The Task Force was constrained because the

Balancing the Scales policy failed to provide the broadly accepted resolution to the underlying mineral resource/conservation reserve conflicts that it was intended to.

Problems associated with the Balancing the Scales policy led to the development of the Resolution of Conflict policy. The implications of this policy in relation to the status of the Environmental Protection Authority Red Book recommendations is discussed below, and in more detail in Section 4.

#### 3.2 Status of the Red Book recommendations

In November 1990 the Government's commitment to implementation of the Red Book recommendations was renewed with the release of the Resolution of Conflict policy. The policy contains a commitment to give effect to all outstanding Red Book recommendations in each System, and to the immediate classification of all recommendations as C Class nature reserves where such classification has previously been delayed by mining interests.

The upgrading of Class C reserves to Class A, or where appropriate to national park, is provided for through review by a Ministerial Council (comprising the Ministers for the Department of Conservation and Land Management, the Environmental Protection Authority, and the Departments of Resources Development and Minerals and Energy, and chaired by the Premier or Deputy Premier). Under the policy all proposed national parks, or extensions to national parks, are subject to a biological and mineral/petroleum resource assessment prior to presentation to Government and subsequently Parliament for final approval.

The previously established B and C Class reserves review process, co-ordinated between the Departments of Conservation and Land Management and Minerals and Energy of WA, to review and where appropriate upgrade the status of existing B and C class nature reserves to Class A, continues under the policy.

The Environmental Protection Authority is co-ordinating implementation of the Red Book recommendations through the Reserves Implementation Group, and the System 6 Co-ordinating Committee and its associated working group.

# 3.3 CALM region management plans and planning initiatives in the Perth metropolitan region

In some regions conservation reserve proposals have been updated since the Environmental Protection Authority Red Book recommendations were released. This process is on-going, notably via the preparation of CALM region management plans, but also through initiatives such as the Shark Bay Region Plan and the current Central Coast Planning Study, co-ordinated by the Department of Planning and Urban Development. These mechanisms have served to review and update conservation reserve proposals, to reflect current knowledge of conservation values and gaps in the reserve coverage of a region's environments, and to facilitate implementation of the intent of the Red Book recommendations in the region.

CALM has twice reviewed recommendations for conservation reserves in the Forest Regions, and updated the Red Book recommendations for the South Coast, the Kimberley and the Goldfields regions. In the Forest Regions particularly, the proposed conservation reserve system represents a major improvement over the 'forest park' options that were available when the Red Book recommendations were being prepared. The latest draft proposals for the forest regions, which update the CALM forest regional management plans, endorsed in 1987, appear in 'Management Strategies for the South-Western Forests of Western Australia-A Review (February 1992)'. For convenience the title is abbreviated in Appendix A of this report to 'CALM 1992 draft South-West Forests Strategy'.

Where these new and updated recommendations have been through a public review process and are approved by the Minister for the Environment, they are regarded as the current interpretation of the proposed reserve system. Red Book recommendations in these areas will be implemented in accordance with the equivalent current proposal. The Environmental Protection Authority

retains an active role in this process in ensuring that the intent of Red Book recommendations is met.

The revised proposals for the Kimberley region prepared by CALM (Nature Conservation Reserves in the Kimberley, 1991) have not completed a formal public review process. However, many of these recommendations are closely based on Environmental Protection Authority Red Book recommendations. Where this is the case these recommendations are regarded as the current interpretation of the Environmental Protection Authority Red Book recommendations. Implementation of new CALM recommendations in the Kimberley region, that is those not based on existing endorsed Environmental Protection Authority Red Book recommendations, are not being pursued through this process.

A list of draft and final CALM Region Management Plans and Reserve Management Plans is attached (Appendix B). Maps of the reserve proposals in the CALM region management plans are also attached (Appendices C, D, E and F).

'Metroplan', developed by the Department of Planning and Urban Development, is the Government's planning strategy for the Perth metropolitan region released in 1990. It is a statement about the direction Perth's development will take into the next century, and provides a general framework for growth and change. 'Metroplan' outlines principles and policies on a number of aspects of growth for the region which aim amongst other things to protect the environment and natural features while developing a comprehensive system of parks and conservation zones.

'Metroplan' identifies fourteen regional parks for the metropolitan area which will implement many of the System 6 recommendations for proposed regional parks together with recent initiatives such as the proposed Jandakot Botanic Park.

To support 'Metroplan' the Department of Planning and Urban Development is preparing structure plans to provide a basis for rezoning and reserving land in the Metropolitan Region Scheme.

Through the planning process System 6 recommendation areas and other areas such as Paganoni and Anstey Swamps, which have important wetlands, stands of tuarts and banksia woodlands, have been reserved.

# 4. Resolution of Conflict Policy

# 4.1 Resolution of Conflict policy commitments

The Resolution of Conflict policy is the latest and most successful endeavour to resolve the differences between between conservation and mining interests.

The issue of mining and conservation has been a source of conflict for many years. In the period since the Environmental Protection Authority Red Book recommendations were developed the public attitude against mining in national parks has hardened substantially and mining interests became a major obstacle to implementation of the outstanding Red Book recommendations.

While no policy is likely to fully meet the objectives of both mining or conservation interests, of the several policy approaches adopted to resolve this deadlock only the current Resolution of Conflict policy has found sufficient common ground to have largely removed the mineral resource issue as an objection to the implementation of conservation reserves.

The major commitments made in the policy are:

- Exploration and mining in national parks is banned, excepting specific provisions in three national parks (Karijini (Hamersley Range), Rudall River and D'Entrecasteaux) and boundary rationalization of a further two parks (Neerabup and Watheroo) to exclude tenements from the reserve;
- Mining in Class A nature reserves requires Parliamentary approval;

- Exploration and mining in Class C nature reserves requires the approval of the Minister for the Environment and the Minister for Mines;
- All outstanding Environmental Protection Authority Red Book recommendations are to be implemented;
- All outstanding Red Book recommendations will be immediately classified as Class C nature reserves, where these recommendations are held up because of mineral resource issues;
- The upgrading of Class C reserves to Class A is facilitated through review by Ministerial Council;
- All new national parks and additions to national parks will require the approval of Parliament and a prior review of biological and mineral/petroleum resources;
- Petroleum drilling in marine parks and proposed marine parks is banned; and
- Amendments to the Mining Act (and the Land Act) are to be implemented to reflect the policy position.

### 4.2 Evolution of the Resolution of Conflict policy

The Resolution of Conflict policy has evolved through several significant developments since its introduction in November 1990. These may be summarised as follows:

- Conservation parks a new category of conservation reserve introduced into the CALM Act in 1991. Conservation parks, which have the same function as national parks, but for areas that may not have the same national significance, were initially envisaged primarily for application in the forest regions and given a security equivalent to State forest and Class A reserves. That is, any amendment to the area, purpose or vesting of the reserve would require Parliamentary approval; similarly proposals to mine in Class A conservation parks would require Parliamentary approval.
  - Since then, Class C conservation parks have been incorporated into the Resolution of Conflict framework, as a possible alternative to the Class C nature reserve (for application throughout the State), where the reserve is intended to serve a recreation as well as conservation function, or where there is a significant Aboriginal interest that cannot be satisfied within the strict function of a nature reserve. Class C conservation parks have the same level of security in relation to mining as Class C nature reserves, but in other respects are afforded the security of Class A reserves in that they require Parliamentary approval to amend the area, purpose or vesting of the reserve.
- Reserves excised from State forest to be Class A it has been accepted that conservation reserves excised from State forest will be reserved directly as Class A reserves (either nature reserves or conservation parks), rather than as less secure Class C reserves. This approach was accepted with the introduction of conservation parks, and is a recognition of the equivalent security status of State forest and A Class reserves.
- Marine Park Policy for WA this policy, which was released in May 1992, has revised and clarified the Resolution of Conflict policy as it applies to the marine environment.

The revised policy maintains the ban on petroleum drilling in marine parks and extends this ban to marine nature reserves and to mineral exploration and mining. The policy also commits Government to the establishment of a representative system of marine parks and marine nature reserves in Western Australia, and specifies a process of implementation involving biological and resource review (equivalent to that for national parks) followed by public review and Parliamentary approval requirements.

The Marine Parks and Reserves Selection Working Group, established in 1987 and coordinated by CALM, is reviewing areas in State waters as potential marine parks and marine nature reserves. The Working Group is expected to report in 1993.

# 4.3 Implications of the Resolution of Conflict policy for reservation of national parks

The increased security from mining given to national parks and marine parks under the policy has a commensurate requirement that all new national parks and additions to national parks proposals undergo a review of biological and mineral/petroleum resource values and an extended (Parliamentary) approval process before being declared.

This lengthy review process has significant implications for the resources required to review and implement these important reserves. Current resources are able to consider only a few of the highest priority proposed national parks a year. For this reason the resources are largely being devoted to establishing Red Book recommendation areas either as Class C nature reserves or conservation parks (Class A for areas excised from State forest) to ensure that they are at least included in the conservation estate, and to facilitate conservation management. The review of these reserves for upgrading to Class A or national park status, where appropriate, is currently a secondary phase for most recommended areas.

# 5. System 6 (metropolitan) implementation programme

### 5.1 System 6 co-ordinating committee

In 1992 a co-ordinating committee comprising chief executives and senior officers of various Government agencies involved in the setting aside and on-going management of System 6 areas in Perth was formed. The committee is chaired by the Environmental Protection Authority and has representatives of the departments of Planning and Urban Development, Conservation and Land Management, Land Administration and Local Government. The WA Municipal Association is also represented on this committee. It has an associated working group which includes a representative of the Conservation Council of WA.

The working group has a programme to accelerate implementation of the System 6 recommendations. The programme is focusing on the Perth metropolitan region, and has initially commenced with the System 6 recommendations considered to have the least constraints to implementation. Areas which have more difficult issues to resolve such as those involving private land, changes to the purpose and vesting of reserves, seeking the acquisition of land, or where there are competing interests will be dealt with subsequently. A significant component of the programme involves liaising and negotiating with local authorities to implement recommendations relating to the tenure, purpose and management of reserves within their jurisdiction.

The programme may identify recommendations that require major modification, or may no longer be appropriate for implementation as part of System 6. A mechanism for implementing the changes will be drawn up with consideration for facilitating public input. This may need to include mechanisms for identifying replacement areas and should give consideration to additions which have been made to Perth's conservation estate outside the System 6 recommendations through the statuary planning process. Where there is a significant increase in the conservation area to be acquired by Government the System 6 co-ordinating committee will need to bid for additional financial resources for acquisition purposes.

### 5.2 Ecoplan

Public involvement has been an integral part of the formulation of the Environmental Protection Authority Red Books and there are strong community expectations about the implementation of the recommendations and opportunities for on-going involvement by people and groups in the care and management of the conservation areas.

While considerable success was achieved in setting aside System 6 recommendations in some areas soon after release of the Red Book report difficulties surfaced in others. These difficulties led to community concern about the establishment of conservation estate based on the System 6 recommendations, particularly in the Perth metropolitan region.

A working group of officers of the Environmental Protection Authority and representatives of a number of Perth's conservation groups was formed to devise a strategy 'System 6 — Ecoplan' to renew community awareness of the System 6 report and its recommendations for urban conservation. The Ecoplan strategy was launched in April 1991.

Since the launch contact has been made with conservation groups, local authorities, schools and teacher associations to meet Ecoplan objectives. These objectives are:

- To develop public ownership of System 6 areas.
- To raise community awareness of System 6.
- To create or motivate existing action groups to seek/and or get involved in the implementation of System 6 recommendations.
- To have a co-ordinated framework for the implementation of System 6 recommendations.

To enable people to understand the issues of urban conservation and see how they might be involved in a meaningful way with Ecoplan, the Environmental Protection Authority runs training workshops for volunteers. These workshops involve presentations from Government departments such as Conservation and Land Management, Planning and Urban Development and the Swan River Trust, as well as local authorities, schools and community groups involved in looking after System 6 areas.

System 6 areas have greatly benefited from the Ecoplan programme with schools and community groups adopting areas such as the Swan River foreshore near Garratt Road bridge, Yellagonga Regional Park, the Ellis Brook Valley and Mary Carroll Park wetland near Gosnells, the Armadale Settlers Common and the Parkerville System 6 area.

The types of projects undertaken by community groups in System 6 areas include bush regeneration to restore and maintain the natural values of areas, using the reserves as an integral part of the school education programme, establishing environmental education facilities for use by schools and the community, and speaking with schools and local residents about the special value of these areas. They have been greatly assisted by State Government agencies, many local authorities as well as funding sources such as the Gordon Reid Foundation in successfully undertaking these programmes.

# 6. Implementation issues

The most common issues requiring resolution to enable the implementation of outstanding Red Book recommendations are those listed below.

# 6.1 Mining interests

At the time the Resolution of Conflict policy was introduced about a half of the outstanding reserve proposals were considered to be prospective or potentially prospective for minerals and petroleum. This was the most significant issue holding back implementation of reserve proposals outside the System 6 Metropolitan Region, and had been a major constraint on reservation for much of the last decade.

The Resolution of Conflict policy has succeeded in largely removing the constraint on implementation of reserve proposals in areas of known or inferred mineral and petroleum prospectivity. Moreover, the decision-making framework it provided has facilitated an enhanced degree of co-operation between the arms of Government serving and regulating the mining and petroleum industries and those with responsibilities for conservation of wildlife and protection of the environment.

The policy provides specific recognition of all areas subject to Red Book recommendations, which are treated for the purposes of the Mining Act as though they are already reserved as C Class nature reserves. Through this means the policy has removed grounds for preventing reservation of recommendations as Class C nature reserves or conservation parks on the basis of mineral and petroleum prospectivity. The policy also provides a review mechanism for C Class reserves to be considered for upgrading to more secure A Class status, or (where recommended) to national park. National parks, marine parks and marine nature reserves are protected by a ban on exploration and mining/petroleum production.

### 6.2 Aboriginal interests

Aboriginal interests in land are diverse, ranging from that of maintaining cultural links by general access to bushland areas, through access to traditional camping sites, or other sites of particular cultural significance and the hunting and gathering of traditional foods, to the reestablishment of living areas and management control and ownership of traditional lands. For this reason, reference in the status table to Aboriginal interests is not exhaustive, or presented in specific detail.

Access to conservation reserves by Aboriginal people for a range of cultural purposes is a regular occurrence in a number of reserves. The scope for such activities exists in all conservation reserves but is somewhat wider in national parks and conservation parks than it is within the stricter conservation function of nature reserves, where controls on camping and hunting, for instance, are more rigourous. The Department of Conservation and Land Management (CALM) and the Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority (AAPA) are in the process of developing policies to provide an agreed framework for addressing Aboriginal interests in conservation reserves.

Aboriginal involvement in reserve management and in some cases the establishment of living areas are significant issues for the implementation of a number of recommendations. This consideration is particularly the case in System 7, and System 12, but is also relevant in other Systems.

At present the Government has recognised the legitimacy of Aboriginal interests in identified conservation reserves through acceptance of the Purnululu (Bungle Bungle) model for national park management, which provides for the establishment of living areas if appropriate, and a Park Council to facilitate Aboriginal involvement in management of the national park.

This issue is one of considerable sensitivity. While the Environmental Protection Authority and the Department of Conservation and Land Management are both of the view that conservation and Aboriginal interests in land are or can be made generally compatible and may offer mutual advantages in some situations, the issue has presented significant challenges in implementing reserve proposals. In large part this reflects the absence of a clearly defined and accepted policy framework for the resolution of these issues, necessitating action on an issue-by-issue basis which has proved to be both time consuming and of uncertain outcome. This is currently being addressed through the development of the joint CALM/AAPA policy mentioned above.

The full implications of the recent High Court decision on the Mabo case, which suggests that national parks and native title may be compatible and so could co-exist, and the similar claim before the High Court by the Ngarinyin, Worora and Wunambul people in the North-West Kimberley, are as yet unclear.

#### 6.3 Pastoral lands

A number of Red Book recommendations relate to lands currently within pastoral leases. Generally the areas involved are of poor grazing potential and their reservation will have limited impact on the viability of the lease. A few recommendations involve either the whole lease, or an area that would affect the viability of the lease. The King Leopold Range recommendations centred on the Mt Hart Pastoral Lease was an example of one of the recommendations that would have affected the viability of the lease. In this situation the whole lease was acquired by Government for reservation, areas not required for conservation are being returned to adjoining

leases in land exchanges to achieve rationalized management boundaries for both the reserve and the adjoining pastoral lease.

All the pastoral lessees involved have been notified of the Environmental Protection Authority Red Book conservation interest in their leases, and of the area involved.

The excision of Red Book recommendation areas for conservation reserves from pastoral leases has been addressed in Governments proposed changes to pastoral land tenure legislation. This legislation has not proceeded, and reserve implementation will proceed through discussion and negotiation directly with individual lessees.

### 6.4 Regional parks

The System 6 Report introduced the concept of regional parks as being large areas of land with conservation, landscape and recreation value. The parks were intended to include land of mixed ownership including land in the control of different Government agencies as well as privately owned freehold land.

The transformation of regional parks from concept to reality has been difficult, primarily because of the range of land tenure involved and funding requirements for on-going management of the parks. The Department of Planning and Urban Development has taken the initiative on a number of the recommendations for individual regional parks. To this end, final reports have been released to establish the Canning River, Beeliar and Yellagonga Regional Parks.

However, initiatives to establish some of the early regional parks highlighted a number of general issues which needed to be resolved to enable the establishment of a co-ordinated park system throughout Perth.

In October 1989 the Government decided that the responsibility for regional parks management be established within the Department of Conservation and Land Management and that the responsibility for overall planning acquisition of lands for region open space be retained by the Department of Planning and Urban Development. Resource assessment will form part of the planning process co-ordinated by the Department of Planning and Urban Development. A task force was also appointed to report back on the complex matters associated with the establishment and management of regional parks.

In September 1992 the Government considered the Task Force report which was prepared by the departments of Conservation and Land Management and Planning and Urban Development. The Government approved amendments to the CALM Act to provide for a category of land to be known as a regional park to be managed by the Department of Conservation and Land Management. An annual amount of \$1.45 million has been allocated to that department for development and management of regional parks with the allocation beginning in the 1993-94 financial year.

The departments of Planning and Urban Development and Conservation and Land Management will initiate the necessary action to implement these recent decisions on regional parks in the near future. These decisions will greatly facilitate further progress in establishing regional parks in the metropolitan area and contribute to the considerable resources necessary to ensure necessary long-term management.

# 6.5 Conservation on private lands in the metropolitan region

The System 6 report included areas of privately owned freehold land and made a general recommendation that there should be an investigation into legislative means of achieving, through public planning procedures, the protection of the conservation and public amenity values of designated privately owned areas without necessitating public acquisition of the land affected. In the absence of these general planning mechanisms the report's recommendations for specific areas of privately owned freehold land have been some of the most difficult to implement.

The CALM Act (Section 16) enables the Department of Conservation and Land Management to enter into agreements with private land owners for the management of the land by the Department for conservation purposes. This has potential relevance to System 6 areas in private ownership but to date no agreements have been reached. The Water Authority and CALM have agreed to pursue a Section 16 agreement to allow CALM to manage the Water Authority freehold enclave in the Serpentine National Park.

The Department of Planning and Urban Development is now investigating the possibility of introducing a rural landscape protection and conservation zone into the Metropolitan Region Scheme. The purpose of the landscape zone would be to protect and enhance landscape and scenic value, important natural features and other environmental qualities; while the conservation zone would aim to protect areas of major significance in terms of natural vegetation or wildlife habitat.

The zones would apply to land of landscape and natural significance but where public access is not required. These initiatives are relevant to some of the System 6 recommendations affecting private land in rural-zoned areas.

#### 6.6 Commonwealth lands

The Environmental Protection Authority Red Books refer to a number of areas owned by the Commonwealth, particularly in the System 6 region. The recommendations for these areas are for the Commonwealth to retain as much uncleared land as possible.

The WA Government does not have legal jurisdiction over any Commonwealth-owned lands including those affected by Red Book recommendations. Development proposals on Commonwealth-owned land may be subject to environmental impact assessment through Commonwealth procedures, with the Environmental Protection Authority advising on the impacts of the proposal through the State Minister for the Environment.

In an endeavour to meet the objectives of the Red Book recommendations the Environmental Protection Authority has approached the relevant Commonwealth agencies through the Department of Arts, Sport, Environment and Territories to seek a commitment to the System recommendations. Commonwealth-owned lands subject to Red Book recommendations are in the control of either the Department of Defence or the Federal Airports Corporation.

Commonwealth agencies have generally indicated, in principle, support for the recommendations but advise that implementation of the recommendations needs to be considered in the context of the primary purpose for which the lands are within their control.

The Department of Defence has a commitment to ecologically sustainable development and landcare in the use and management of lands within its control. It recognises the conservation value of many of its lands and has a programme to prepare land management plans for each of its properties. The Federal Airports Corporation is currently considering options for use of Perth and Jandakot airports and the Environmental Protection Authority has had preliminary discussions with the Corporation and Commonwealth environmental agencies outlining System 6 and other environmental issues relevant to these areas.

### 6.7 Local authority interests

Many recommendations, particularly within System 6, are proposed to be vested in and managed by local authorities. Others are proposed to have their vesting and purpose amended, for example by the reserve being taken out of the control of the local authority and placed with another agency such as the Department of Conservation and Land Management.

Local authorities have made an important but variable contribution to achieving the objectives of Red Book recommendations in many localities. In some instances local authority issues have impeded implementation of the recommendations. This reluctance may be because the shire does not wish to take on vesting and management responsibilities due to associated on-going financial implications, or because some of these areas are a regional resource. In other instances the local authority may not wish for an area to be set aside for conservation purposes because of

its value for other purposes or the road making materials it contains such as limestone and gravel. The Environmental Protection Authority continues to have discussions with local authorities about these matters where they have previously impeded implementation of the System 6 recommendations with progress being made in some areas.


The following notes are intended to assist in the interpretation of the Table:

- The table lists each Red Book recommendation and part recommendation by System number. Lengthy recommendations have been abbreviated in order to save space.
- Reference in the recommendations to specific agencies have been updated to refer to the current equivalent agency where this has changed since the recommendations were written.

#### Thus:

- National Parks Board, National Parks Authority, and the WA Wildlife Authority, become the National Parks and Nature Conservation Authority (NPNCA);
- Department of Fisheries and Wildlife and the Forests Department become the Department of Conservation and Land management (CALM);
- The Conservator of Forests becomes Executive Director of CALM, or the Lands and Forests Commission;
- The Public Works Department, becomes the Water Authority;
- Department of Mines becomes Department of Minerals and Energy of WA (DOMEWA);
- Department of Land and Surveys, becomes the Department of Land Administration (DOLA);
- The Department of Conservation and Environment becomes the Environmental Protection Authority;
- The Metropolitan Region Planning Authority becomes the Department of Planning and Urban Development.(DPUD).
- The implementation status of each recommendation in the table is classified into one of five groupings as follows:
  - Reserved/Implemented meaning that action has been taken that has reserved the area referred to in the recommendation for conservation, or where the recommendation calls for some specific action this action has been completed such the recommendation is implemented;
  - Intent Being Met refers to those recommendations which require an on-going action and indicates that the necessary action is being taken;
  - Partially Implemented refers to the situation where a recommendation may refer to reservation of several areas, or require several actions, and only some of those areas are reserved, or actions are complete;
  - Issues Resolved/Implementation Progressing 'Issues Resolved' refers to recommendations, or part recommendations where the substantive issues have been resolved such that they are cleared ready for implementation. They may be about to be referred to DOLA for reservation, or awaiting resolution of another part recommendation to enable them to be implemented. 'Implementation Progressing' refers to those recommendations that have been referred to DOLA and are in the process of being reserved, awaiting Reserves Bill action, or Parliamentary approval for revocation from State forest; or in the case of proposed regional parks, management plans, conservation on private land, or reservation under the Metropolitan Region Scheme are actively in the process of being prepared through a departmental or local authority study.

- **Unresolved Issues** Those recommendations where there are still one or more substantive issues to be resolved before the recommendation can proceed, and;
- **No Longer Appropriate** Those relatively few situations where the intent of the recommendation is judged to be no longer appropriate. Other action may have been taken that precludes the recommendation from being implemented, or the area may no longer be of conservation significance.


