New excursions at Wellington Discovery Forest and Margaret River Eco Discovery Centre

2005 starts with a new opportunity for students in Years 2 to 4. The new excursion, called *Investigating the Forest*, follows on very well from *Busy in the Forest* (recommended for PP to Year 3).

Investigating the Forest guides young students to more detailed information about key flora species in the Jarrah forest and to discover that it's a very colourful place indeed!

Students participate in this exciting new Treasure Trail full of activities and experiences. They have the opportunity to gain further knowledge about the unique Jarrah Forest and take information back to school to share after the excursion. Students also test their skills on the Sense-ational Trail, a tried and true favourite.

Teachers trialling the excursion raved about the Treasure Trail and one teacher described it as: "Very appealing to young students. Sharon (our EcoEducation Officer) was great at explaining clearly, in suitable language, each 'treasure'. It was a great activity". Another teacher said it "was an excellent excursion and I would highly recommend it to any other school".

New prices

Due to increasing operating costs, unfortunately we have had to increase our prices to assist with covering some of our expenses. All standard day excursions are now charged at \$ 7.15 per student.

On camp, Sense-ational Nightlife and Monitoring Marsupials are now \$5.50 per student and Marvellous Macroinvertebrates is \$4.40 per student. All prices include GST. Minimum group sizes remain the same, 23 for PP to Year 3 and 25 otherwise. Maximum group sizes 28 for PP to Year 3 and 32 otherwise.
