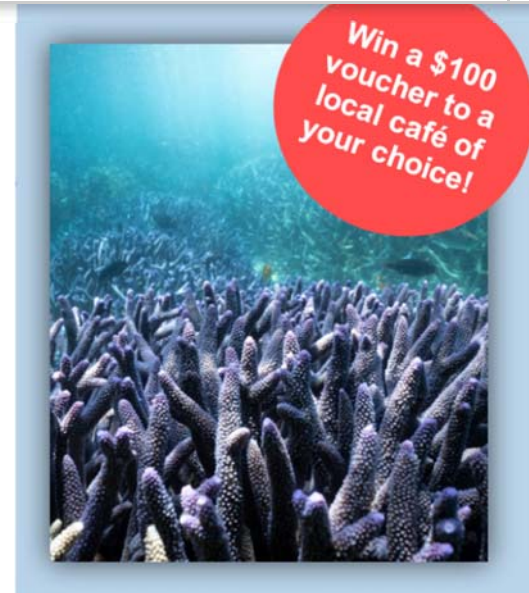
Have your say on the future of the Ningaloo Coast
