

Whale sharks cruise the waters of the Ningaloo Marine Park every year from mid-March to the end of July to feed in the plankton rich waters. Visitors from all over



the world flock to swim with the biggest fish in the sea.

Whale shark interaction tours operate daily from both Exmouth and Coral Bay. Tours include transfers from accommodation, lunch, refreshments and all snorkelling gear with wetsuits available on request. Now is the best time for this amazing experience.


