The Department of Parks and Wildlife's Strategic Directions for 2014-17 outlines how the department will continue on-ground animal and plan conservation, improve recreation an tourism facilities, and enhance local and landscape scale management outcomes.

#### Fitzgerald River National Park facilities opened

Significant improvements to road access and new and upgraded visitor facilities have put <u>Fitzgerald River National Park</u> firmly on the agenda as one of the must-see places to visit in the south

coast. The park's unique flora and stunning landscapes can now be experience and enjoyed via these by world-class visitor facilities.

Forty kilometres of sealed roads, campgrounds, viewing

platforms, interpretative displays and walk trails were <u>officially opened</u> by the Premier of Western Australia, Hon. Colin Barnett, in June. A further 40km of gravel roads were upgraded.

## New Aboriginal Cultural Immersion experience

A new Aboriginal Cultural Immersion experience has received excellent reviews from participants. Koomal Dreaming have joined with Wharncliffe Mill Bush Retreat and Eco Tours to offer a two-day experience in Wardandi and Bibbulmun country. Participants have the opportunity to see the world from the perspective of a Traditional Owner and build their own cultural

awareness by understanding the connection to country. Participants try traditional bush foods and fire-lighting, learn about bush medicine and share stories of the Dreaming spirits.

#### **Prescribed burning**

Parks and Wildlife prescribed burning program as opportunities arise to provide additional protection for properties and life.

The department conducts broad scale burns in the autumn and spring seasons to assist in reducing the impact of large scale bushfires.

All prescribed burns are carefully planned and mapped out to protect communities.

While there may be short-term inconveniences such as smoke and road closures, these burns will greatly reduce bushfire risk.

It's estimated that 30,000 whales travel along the WA coast each year, and the Department of Fisheries with Parks and Wildlife have created an app so you can reporting any sightings and support research into whale migration.

Researchers need to learn more about whale



movement patterns and you can help by reporting any sightings of the many whale species you see as they make their journeys through the State's coastal waters.
