Turtle nesting on the Ningaloo Coast

Book a guided turtle interaction experience for an exciting opportunity to see marine turtles nesting in their natural environment and learn more about turtle conservation.

The tours operate from December to March from the Jurabi Turtle Centre, 20 minutes north of Exmouth, and include an educational presentation about marine turtle biology, ecology, threats and conservation measures followed by a guided turtle interaction experience on a popular turtle rookery beneath the breathtaking Ningaloo night sky.



Visiting parks during bushfire season

The bushfire season is upon us! Summer is a great time to enjoy the outdoors and extra care should be taken when travelling or camping in the natural environment.

Be prepared to modify your plans, especially if it is hot and windy, and be aware that very high to catastrophic fire danger ratings may result in the closure of parks and reserves.

Open fires or any cooking appliances that use solid fuels, are not permitted on these days.

You can still use a gas-fuelled barbecue and gas-fuelled camping stove, or use one of the many hot plates provided for visitor use in campgrounds and picnic areas. Search for campgrounds and picnic areas with gas barbecues in Park Finder or the booklet National, marine and regional parks in Western Australia.

Play it safe this summer and enjoy your park visits. Go to <u>Are You Bushfire Ready?</u> for all your bushfire season information.





Temporary Bibbulmun Track diversion

A 90-kilometre section of the Bibbulmun Track, including five camp sites, between Deeside Coast Road and Walpole may be diverted until late summer 2015 while major prescribed burns are carried out. The precise timing of the burns depends on factors such as weather conditions and is yet to be finalised.

While every effort will be made to minimise impacts on walkers, you may choose to plan walks on other sections of the track while the diversions are in place.

Osprey Bay campground upgrades underway

Work has begun to upgrade the popular Osprey Bay campground in <u>Cape Range National Park</u> near Exmouth with funding from the State Government's <u>Parks for People</u> initiative.

Osprey Bay has sweeping ocean views, fantastic snorkelling opportunities, boat launching access, kayak moorings nearby and is also close to Sandy Bay. By April next year it will re-open with twice the number of campsites and new toilet facilities. Improved traffic flow will see two camp site loops, each with their own walking tracks to the beach, and a separate road for boat launching and day time visitors. Read more.



Tourism boost for Albany

An exciting development at the Gap and Natural Bridge in <u>Torndirrup National Park</u> will provide spectacular new lookouts, pathways and interpretive signage for more than 200,000 visitors per year to the popular Albany tourist destination.



Designed to enhance the visitor experience, the lookouts will provide a closer, more dramatic view of the beautiful coastal environment while incorporating key safety design features. The improvements being done by Parks and Wildlife are being funded by Royalties for Regions program under the *Parks for People* initiative.

The Gap Road is now closed until June 2015 for safety reasons during the construction but the rest of the park remains open. Read more.

Have you walked on the Bibbulmun Track in the past four weeks or know somone who has?


The <u>Bibbulmun Track user survey</u> will help with future planning, management and maintenance of the track and finishes soon.


John Forrest National Park is Western Australia's first national park and Parks and Wildlife is looking at its future recreational needs.
