New campground facilities

More new caravanning and camping facilities have been completed in time for the upcoming July school holidays.

The first of two loops to be finished at the new Gnaala Mia campground in Dryandra Woodland has a range of camp sites suitable for tents through to larger caravans. The sites are carefully nestled in the forest at least 20m apart for a more private forest experience.



Some of the new camp sites at [Logue Brook](#) cater for caravans and boats but a number are also specifically designed just for tents, with views of the lake. The new pump track is already getting a workout from young mountain bikers!

Miners campground and picnic area in [Coalseam Conservation Park](#) has long been popular as a quiet stopover and a great base for wildflower viewing in spring.

Perup Conservation & Science Safari

Award-winning tour operators Global Gypsies have added an exciting new hands-on wildlife experience to their calendar – a research and conservation “voluntour” in conjunction with the Parks and Wildlife.

The inaugural Perup Conservation and Science Safari will run from October 18 to 25, 2015. For eight fun, busy and

educational days in the spring, you can help to capture, ‘process’ and monitor a range of native marsupials at Perup Sanctuary, just 50km east of Manjimup in the heart of the forest. You can also work on flora-related projects, enjoy guided bushwalks, go bird watching, visit local attractions and learn about the local eco-system.

The package includes twin-share accommodation in the sanctuary’s rammed earth guesthouse and quality catering by the Global Gypsies ‘1000-star’ outback cooking team. Partial proceeds will be donated to Perup to support its important conservation and rehabilitation projects.





Have your say on new parks near Broome

The Yawuru Birragun Conservation Park and Proposed Yawuru Nagulagun / Roebuck Bay Marine Park form part of the Yawuru conservation estate. This is an exciting new venture in which lands and waters around Broome are being jointly managed in partnership by the Parks and Wildlife and the Yawuru people, the native title holders of the area.


The public comment period closes on 25 September 2015.

Get involved in the Adventure Activity Standards Review

Adventure Activity Standards (AAS) describe industry requirements and responsibilities for organisations and leaders conducting outdoor adventure activities for groups where the participants are dependent upon the activity provider. They reflect common safe practice as identified by the outdoor sector.

Outdoors WA is reviewing the AAS for Bushwalking, Challenge Ropes, Four-wheel Driving and Snorkelling and Wildlife Swims.

If you have an interest in one or more of these outdoor activities go to outdoorswa.org.au/Interact/AAS2015 and:



- download and read the latest versions of the AAS
- provide feedback via the online questionnaire -your views are important even if you don't see the need for any changes
- if other people in your network might be interested, download the flyer and share it with them.

You can also nominate to be part of the Technical Working Committee that review and ratify any changes.
