Trees Adventure Lane Poole Park is located 100km from Perth, in Lane Poole

Reserve near Dwellingup. With more than 80 challenges and a kilometre of flying foxes, the courses are built in the beautiful pine and jarrah trees near Nanga Mill campground.



Enjoy national parks this summer

Summer is a great time to enjoy national parks. Here are four tips to help you enjoy getting away from it all and to play it safe.

- Choose parks that are more enjoyable from November to March, especially those with water or with plenty of natural shade. If you travel inland, plan for high temperature and take precautions.
- If you plan to camp at a busy time like the Christmas/New Year festive season or a long weekend, check our <u>Peak Period Availability</u> guide.



- You won't be able to light a fire. Use your own gas-fuelled barbecue or camping stove or use one of the many hot plates provided free for visitor use in campgrounds and picnic areas. Search for picnic areas and campgrounds with gas barbecues in <u>Park Finder</u> or the booklet <u>National, marine and regional</u> <u>parks in Western Australia</u>.
- Take extra care when travelling or camping. Be prepared to modify your plans, especially if it is hot and windy, and be aware that on days of very high to catastrophic fire danger ratings <u>parks and reserves may be closed</u>.

Early Christmas gift for Torndirrup National Park visitors

The State Government is providing a sneak preview of the \$5.75 million redevelopment of tourist facilities at The Gap and Natural Bridge. The area will be opened temporarily from Saturday, 5 December until mid-January for the public to enjoy during the summer school holidays.

Due to challenges in fabricating stainless steel elements of the spectacular Gap lookout structure, the multimillion dollar redevelopment will not be completed until next year.



The Natural Bridge lookout, picnic area, car park and interpretative signage have all been completed and will be available for visitors to access, but the Gap lookout site will remain a construction site and closed to the public.

Kalbarri skywalks capture new gorge views

Sealed roads and cutting-edge viewing structures will soon provide exciting and accessible panoramas of the Murchison River Gorge in <u>Kalbarri National Park</u>.

New skywalks will take people of all ages and abilities beyond the gorge rim more than 100m above the Murchison River for breathtaking, unobstructed views. The sealed road, parking for coaches and large caravans, shade shelters and toilets will make the trip significantly more comfortable.



The park already receives over 300,000 visitors a year and the sealed road will put the gorge on the agenda for many more visitors to the area. Construction will begin in 2016 and the facilities are expected to open in 2017.

Entry fee introductions in 2016

Entry fees will come into effect at Lane Poole Reserve, Torndirrup and West Cape Howe national parks and Two Peoples Bay Nature Reserve as of 4 April 2016. The fees will be \$12 per vehicle, the same as at the other 29 parks that already have entry fees.

The State Government has recently invested substantial sums through *Royalties for Regions* to upgrade facilities in Lane Poole Reserve and in the Albany area. Revenue generated by the new fees



will be retained locally to assist with future park management, contributing toward the upgrade and maintenance of visitor facilities, enhanced management presence during peak times and supporting nature conservation efforts. It will go some way to ensure that the exceptional visitor experiences provided can be maintained to a high standard into the future.

Passes that provide unlimited access to all parks for twelve months are available at <u>shop.dpaw.wa.gov.au</u>, at Parks and Wildlife offices and selected visitor centres and retail outlets. Current pass holders need take no action at all and will receive even better value for money.





Volunteers of the year recognised

The Minister for Environment Hon Albert Jacob MLA and Parks and Wildlife recognised the outstanding efforts of volunteers at the 2015 Volunteer of the Year and Outstanding Service Awards on 2 December.

No less than 4636 volunteers contributed more than 610,000 hours to Parks and Wildlife projects in 2014-15, a record amount. Volunteers perform a variety of tasks from staffing the Wildcare Helpline to working in national parks,



assisting in plant and animal monitoring, invasive weed control programs, species recovery projects and many others.

Minister Jacob presented Bruce and Kay Withnell with the prestigious Parks and Wildlife Volunteer of the Year award. He said the Withnells showed great commitment as full-time caretakers of the homestead at Matuwa over a six-month period, welcoming and managing visitors and maintaining amenities while contributing to the Rangelands Restoration project at the former pastoral lease. "They also went above and beyond the call of duty, responding with initiative and dedication when two bushfires came through the area, threatening the fenced enclosure where many species of rare and unique native animals live."

Fifteen Outstanding Service awards were presented to volunteers for their service, dedication and commitment across Western Australia. Ten volunteers were presented with certificates for long service for contributing over 20 years continual volunteering for the department.



Horizontal Falls park plan open for public comment

Have your say on the future of one of the world's most significant cultural and natural tourist attractions - Horizontal Falls and surrounding areas on WA's Kimberley coast.

The State Government, in partnership with the Dambimangari traditional owners, has released the draft management plan for the proposed Lalang-garram / Horizontal Falls and North Lalang-garram marine parks and the proposed Oomeday National Park. The area is in the



Dambimangari people's homelands and is considered one of the most pristine coastal areas left in the world. It contains nationally significant natural, Aboriginal and historical values.

The parks are being delivered as a part of the State Government's Kimberley Science and Conservation Strategy, which is creating one of the world's largest networks of connected marine and terrestrial reserves. The plan creates tourism and employment opportunities for traditional owners and is available here for public comment until 22 January 2016.

Swan Canning River Protection Strategy released

Perth's much-loved Swan and Canning rivers will remain vibrant and accessible for all Western Australians under the new Swan Canning River Protection Strategy.

The strategy has been developed in partnership with 21 local government authorities, State Government agencies, NRM groups and with extensive community consultation. It provides a master plan to guide investment, keep the rivers healthy and ensure they are accessible for the community to enjoy in the long term.



A key priority is encouraging greater community awareness and collaboration, with about \$2 million provided this financial year for priority Riverbank projects.


