Parks and visitor information

Holiday camping

The April school holidays and Easter are two of the best and most popular times to go camping in WA's national parks.

Planning ahead can help ensure you have a great time.

If you are heading for a campground without online booking check our [Peak Period Availability](#) guide to see if there is room before you leave home. Plan to leave as early as you can but keep an eye on things. Many people are able to move in before the holidays start.



If you can book a camp site you will have much more certainty. There are now even more places where you can book ahead, with [Martins Tank in Yalgorup National Park](#) and [Conto Campground in Leeuwin Naturaliste National Park](#) now bookable online. All campgrounds in [Cape Range National Park](#) will be online booking only after 23 March.

With Easter only two weeks away it is likely that no bookable sites will be available in most places although there may be availability for single nights in some places. Check now!

If you are going in the April school holidays you may have more options. Even so, check now and book if you can!

If you miss out you might be able to stay nearby but outside the park and make day trips. Next time be sure to book a camp site early! Bookings can be made up to 180 days in advance so be prepared to plan early and lock in your dates.

Easter is early this year and you might not be able to light a fire. Plan to use your own gas-fuelled barbecue or camping stove or use one of the many hot plates provided free for visitor use in campgrounds and picnic areas. Search for campgrounds with gas barbecues in [Park Finder](#) and take food that you can cook on barbecue.

New campground booking arrangements for Cape Range National Park

If you plan to camp in [Cape Range National Park](#) please be aware that from 23 March 2016 online bookings will be essential for **all** of the campgrounds in the park. You will need to have booked a camp site before you arrive.



With great beaches and access to the famous Ningaloo Reef, Cape Range is a very popular park. Don't miss out. If you want to camp in Cape Range, get in early and lock in your dates. Bookings can be made up to 180 days in advance for the peak season from March to November.

Help save our cockies

WA's black cockatoos need help.

Over the last 10 years Parks and Wildlife has banded more than 1000 black cockatoos including rehabilitated birds and nearly 900 Carnaby's nestlings. To help research into the birds' movements and population survival, people are being asked to take photos of banded birds and send them in to the department.

Digital SLR cameras with large zoom lenses are best for photographing leg bands but even small cameras with zooms at high resolution can work. Please send your photos and the location where they were taken to Parks and Wildlife via [Facebook private message](#), or by email to fauna@dpaw.wa.gov.au.

People are also being encouraged to register for the annual Great Cocky Count. This long-term citizen science survey of black cockatoos in WA is being held on Sunday 3 April and involves watching known roost sites and counting cockatoos as they come in to roost in the evening.

Park passes available for entry to Lane Poole Reserve, Torndirrup and West Cape Howe national parks and Two Peoples Bay Nature Reserve

As advised in the December 2015 issue of *Touring WA*, entry fees will come into effect

at Lane Poole Reserve, Torndirrup and West Cape Howe national parks and Two Peoples Bay Nature Reserve on 4 April 2016. The standard fee of \$12 per vehicle with up to 12 occupants, or \$6 concession, will apply.

If you, your friends or your relatives live near any of these parks, a Local Residents Park Pass at \$15 will be the best option. This pass will be valid until 3 April 2017. After this the best option will be an Annual Local Park Pass at \$22 for 12 months.

Local Residents Park Passes for Lane Poole Reserve (pass also includes Serpentine National Park) are available to residents and ratepayers of the shires of Murray and Waroona from:

- Waroona Visitor Centre
- Dwellingup History and Visitor Information Centre
- Lane Poole Reserve.

Local Residents Park Passes for Torndirrup and West Cape Howe national parks and Two Peoples Bay Nature Reserve (pass also includes Fitzgerald River, Porongurup and Stirling Range national parks) are available to residents and ratepayers of the City of Albany from:

- Albany Visitor Centre.

Other passes are available at these visitor centres, at shop.dpaw.wa.gov.au, Department of Parks and Wildlife offices and selected visitor centres and retail outlets.

Invitation to comment on the Proposed North Kimberley Marine Park indicative joint management plan 2016

The indicative joint management plan for the proposed North Kimberley Marine Park has been released for public comment. You are invited to have your say on how these areas will be managed into the future.

The park is being established under the [Kimberley Science and Conservation Strategy](#) and once created will contribute to one of the world's largest networks of interconnected marine and terrestrial reserves. In recognition of the significant cultural values and ongoing connections to sea country, it is intended that the marine park will be jointly managed with traditional owners.

The closing date for submissions is Friday 20 May 2016.
