As of the 1 September 2017, entry fees into all fee paying parks and campgrounds across the State will incur a slight increase.

All fees collected are retained by the Department to assist in conservation and park management, including the improvement of visitor services and facilities, so that you can continue to enjoy these special areas of our State.



The Annual Parks Pass and the Holiday Pass are excellent value for money and definitely the way to go if you plan to visit more than one park.
