

Discover somewhere new and head north for some sunshine!

We have opened new campgrounds north of Perth where you can stop in for a night on your way to visit the new Kalbarri Skywalk or stay awhile and explore the area.

Wake up beside the ocean and camp at the new Wanagarren Campground right next to Jurien Bay Marine Park. Campsites can be booked online but you'd better be quick as there are only 15 campsites that are suitable for tents and rooftop tents only.

To stay here you must have a portable chemical toilet and the site is accessible by four-wheel-drive only.

Just in time for wildflower season, the new Karda Campground has opened right next to Lesueur National Park, about 20km east of Jurien Bay.

Karda has 31 campsites suitable for all types of camping equipment and each campsite has a picnic table and fire-pit.

While you're there, be sure to explore Lesueur National Park and see the incredible wildflowers in spring or check out the crystal blue waters of Jurien Bay Marine Park.

Kalgulup Regional Park

Kalgulup Regional Park, which means place of fire in Noongar language, is the amalgamation of two regional parks, the Preston River to Ocean and Leschenault regional parks, and will cover more than 3,100 hectares.



You have the opportunity to have your say on the proposed park with

the *Kalgulup Regional Park draft management plan 2020* now available for public comment. The plan will provide guidance for the management of lands by a range of State Government agencies and local governments.

There is a two-month public comment period on the management plan, which closes 15 October 2020. View the plan and have your say at dbca.wa.gov.au/haveyoursay.

Management plan for the Pilbara inshore islands

You are invited to review the *Pilbara* inshore islands nature reserves and proposed additions draft management plan and contribute ideas on how the islands will be managed. The plan covers over 170 islands, islets and rocks between Exmouth Gulf and Cape Preston.



It outlines how the natural, cultural and social values of the islands will be conserved, threatened species including turtles and birds are to be protected, and how people
