While you will notice many changes in LANDSCOPE, one thing hasn't changed, it continues to be designed, produced and packaged in Western Australia; supporting local people and businesses.

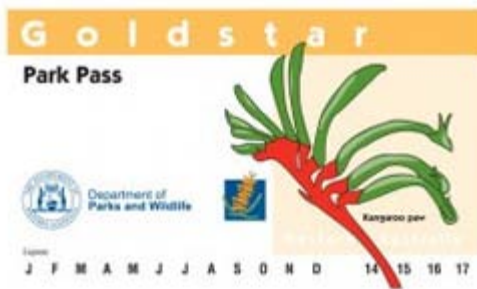

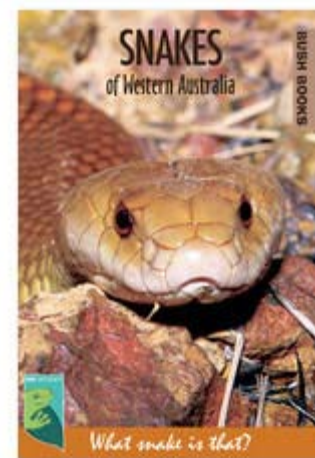
Snakes of Western Australia
