
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Best of the South West




Rediscover Perth outdoors



Two Peoples Bay Nature Reserve is a favourite with thousands of visitors every year. It's crystal clear water and squeaky white sand against granite headlands make it one of the most picturesque areas near Albany.



This pretty pink flower known only by its scientific name *Kunzea eriocalyx*, occurs nowhere else in the world except three sites within Fitzgerald River National Park on WA's south coast.
