Description of Incident: Butyric acid has been used by protestors in the FPC's head office.	

Equipment Involved:

Butyric Acid is physically characterised as a colourless oily liquid, with a very unpleasant smell and acrid taste. The substance is rated as a mild to moderate irritant and can be absorbed into the body by inhaling its vapours. The substance is also corrosive to the eyes, skin respiratory and digestive tracts.

Prevention of Harm

Prevention of harm should focus on avoiding all contact, and avoid inhaling or accidentally consuming the substance (i.e.do not eat, drink or smoke if there is any chance of contact) Exposure may be more serious for individuals with pre-existing respiratory conditions (e.g. asthmatics) or allergies. The substance is also flammable, so open flames should not be near the substance.

Recommendations: Preventing Exposure

All physical contact and inhalation must be avoided

Appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) must be used during tasks involving potential exposure.
