Humpback whales that began their annual migration in autumn from the nutrient rich Southern Ocean to their breeding grounds in the Kimberley are now beginning to head back south down the Western Australian coast.

In a trial program approved by the State Government, Western Australia is now one of the premier destinations in the world for swimming with humpback whales. Visitors to Ningaloo Marine Park can swim with these massive marine mammals as they traverse the Coral Coast.

Murujuga extended



Picture: The rock art at Murujuga National Park is sacred for Aboriginal people and traditional custodians the Ngarluma-Yindjibarndi, the Yaburara-Mardudhunera and the Wong-goo-tt-oo people.

The huge cultural significance of the Pilbara's Murujuga National Park is further recognised in a recently announced State Government decision to expand its area.

The additional parcel of land was previously zoned for industrial use. It will be transferred to the Murujuga Aboriginal Corporation to be leased back to the State and managed as part of the park.
