

The 2021 Foundation AGM will be held on Thursday 28 October 2021 at 5.00pm, 62 Aberdeen Street, Northbridge.



Use of wheeled vehicles and devices

As a general rule they are not permitted on the Bibbulmun Track. The Track passes through extensive areas of Dieback Risk Areas (DRA), where the movement of wheeled vehicles is restricted by law to minimise the potential spread of dieback.

The McGowan Labor Government has made the historic decision to protect the State's native forests from 2024 protecting at least an additional 400,000 hectares of karri, jarrah and wandoo forests. They plan to invest a record \$350 million to expand Western Australia's softwood timber plantations to create and support sustainable WA jobs.

Trail upgrades and infrastructure on several popular trails are commencing as part of the Great Southern Adventure Trails (GSAT) project. <u>Read more...</u>




Safety on the Trail


Favourite Short Walk

Perth Hills Discovery Centre to Mundaring Weir Distance: 8km return Difficulty: Grade 3, Time: 2.5-3.5 hours

Starting from the Perth Hills Discovery Centre, this return walk leads you through the beautiful jarrah forest of Beelu National Park to Mundaring Weir and Lake CY O'Connor. Along this section of the Track, you'll pass picnic areas home to kangaroos and birdlife, as well as the historic Mundaring Weir Hotel, where you and the kids can enjoy a yummy pub lunch. Walk along the weir wall for an excellent view over the water. On the way back, visit the No. 1 Pumping Station (entry fees apply) at the base of the dam wall to learn about the fascinating history of the weir and its pipeline, which transports water all the way to Kalgoorlie.




...... There are many businesses and organisations along the entire length of the Track that offer goods and services to help you get the most out of your walk, whether it be for a few

...... The Foundation relies on funding from various sources, access to funding is often dependent on demonstrating how many people use the Bibbulmun Track. Without these grants and sponsorship's the Track, its' shelters and bridges would not be maintained, repaired, rebuilt and in the wonderful condition it is for us to all enjoy.



Also at a practical level if there is a fire or other disaster, where possible the log books will be checked. It is really helpful to know who's on the track. Similarly if an epirb is fired off, checking the log book can be useful to know who is in the area of the signal.
