## Lysiana casuarinae (Miq.) Tiegh.



*Lysiana casuarinae* is a broadly circumscribed, aerial, parasitic plant or mistletoe that can be found growing on a range of host species. This image represents the type (true) form, which in the Perth region occurs predominantly on *Casuarina* 

<u>(https://florabase.dpaw.wa.gov.au/browse/profile/21301?ref=florabase.ghost.io)</u>, hence the specific epithet. It has green, terete leaves with banana-shaped, yellow flowers fading to red-orange with age. Plants are commonly seen along the Canning and Swan River foreshore flowering from late January to February. Plants can often be seen with another mistletoe <u>Amyema linophylla</u> <u>(https://florabase.dpaw.wa.gov.au/browse/profile/2375?ref=florabase.ghost.io)</u>, which has red flowers and grey terete foliage, with flowers from December to January. On occasion, both species can be seen on the same tree, <u>Casuarina obesa</u>
