This year our Adopt-a-Spot volunteer numbers increased to over 50,000 which is outstanding. Next year, KABC will be moving towards a reusable alternative to plastic bags for litter collections and we would love to hear from you on ideas for how you can use reusable bags. We held nine Clean Schools workshops across the state this year, with 29 new schools joining the program.
