Clean Up Bunbury



The City of Bunbury recently partnered with KABC's <u>Adopt-a-Spot</u> program to encourage individuals, community groups and schools to contribute to a cleaner environment.

Students from Djidi Djidi Aboriginal School adopted Glen Iris Skate park, located next door to its campus, and worked with the city and KABC to organise their first cleanup.

The students, councillors and KABC staff removed 38kgs of litter from the park, which was an outstanding effort. The

top items collected were plastic food packaging, hard pieces of plastic and broken glass. A fishing rod, blow up paddle pool and a toddler bike were among the more unusual items found.

The following day, a community clean-up event saw almost 40 members of the community brave the weather conditions to clean up Koombana Bay and surrounds.

The Dolphin Discovery Centre's Storm Chasers group kindly volunteered to audit the eight bags of litter that were collected during the Koombana Bay clean-up.



Staff from the Bunbury Forum Shopping Centre hope to organise their first clean-up of their adopted site, Horseshoe Lake, in the coming weeks.

Thank you to everyone involved in raising the profile of the Adopt-a-Spot program in Bunbury and making these events so successful.
